## WATER RESOURCES POLICY AND COMMUNICATIONS COMMITTEE

### FINANCIAL BENEFITS OF CONSTRUCTING OFF-SITE IMPROVEMENTS FOR RECYCLED WATER RETROFIT PROJECTS

#### SUMMARY:

Retrofitting customer sites for recycled water use commonly requires construction of new recycled water service connections and in some cases new recycled water pipelines. Both are considered off-site improvements. Prior to the construction of new off-site improvements, staff considers the benefits to IRWD. In September 2020, staff presented an analysis to the Water Resources Policy and Communications Committee that established a rationale for funding off-site improvements based on estimated benefits. Staff has updated the analysis and determined that over a 15-year period, IRWD avoids a net present value cost of \$11,533 per acre-foot (AF) of potable water saved as a result of retrofitting a customer site.

#### BACKGROUND:

For many years, IRWD has successfully expanded the use of recycled water within its service area by connecting new customers to the recycled water system. While most new customers are the result of new construction, staff also pursues retrofit projects that convert potable water uses to recycled water. Retrofits commonly require construction of new recycled water service connections involving a pipeline from IRWD's recycled water distribution system and setting a customer meter. In some cases, IRWD needs to extend its distribution system as well as construct a recycled water service. The cost to design and construct recycled water pipelines, services, and setting a meter is usually borne by IRWD while the customer funds the improvements needed downstream of the meter.

The cost to construct a new recycled water pipeline and / or service varies based on the diameter and length of the pipe, underground utility conditions, local construction requirements, and traffic control. Services typically range from \$20,000 to \$100,000 excluding the design costs.

#### Financial Benefits of Recycled Water Conversions:

The financial benefit to IRWD of constructing new off-site improvements to convert a site to recycled water is the avoided cost of purchasing potable water from the Municipal Water District of Orange County (MWDOC), which is IRWD's most expensive source of potable water. IRWD currently pays \$1,256 per AF for treated water purchased from MWDOC. The pass-thru cost of non-potable / recycled water to IRWD customers within their water budget is \$859 per AF. Therefore, converting a site to recycled water currently saves IRWD \$397 per AF (in 2024 dollars) for water delivered to customers. As described below, staff performed a net present value analysis of these avoided costs to assist in making decisions on when to implement off-site improvements. This analysis is an update to avoided costs presented to the Committee in September 2020.

*Net Present Value Analysis:*

Three important factors were considered when calculating the net present value of avoided costs associated with funding off-site improvements for a retrofit project: 1) project life, 2) commodity cost escalation, and 3) the expected discount rate. A period of 15 years is a conservative estimate for the life of a retrofit project. For the escalation of commodity rates, staff used Metropolitan’s five-year forecast for treated water rates and IRWD’s five-year forecast for recycled water rates. Average rates of increase from the first five years were applied to years 6 through 15. Staff assumed 4% as the 15-year discount rate.

Based on this, the net present value of avoided costs was calculated, which can be used as a guideline when deciding to fund off-site improvements to convert a site to recycle water. The net present value analysis is presented in Exhibit “A”. The analysis demonstrates that over a 15-year period, IRWD avoids a net present value cost of \$11,533 per acre-foot (AF) of potable water saved. The following table shows the amount that is considered reasonable to fund off-site improvements based on a range of potable water savings projects.

Other non-monetized benefits that IRWD considers when planning, designing, and constructing off-site improvements for retrofit projects include increased water supply reliability, local supply diversification, and the benefits to IRWD customers.

FISCAL IMPACTS:

The approved capital budget for FY 2023-25 includes Project 11797, which is intended to pay for the construction of off-site recycled water improvements for the conversion of non-residential customer sites from potable to recycled water.

ENVIRONMENTAL COMPLIANCE:

Conversion projects are exempt from the California Environmental Quality Act in conformance with California Code of Regulation, Title 14, Chapter 3, Section 15301(b), which provides exclusion for minor alteration of public facilities, and Section 15282(j), which provides that installation of new pipeline or maintenance, repair restoration, removal, or demolition of an existing pipeline as set forth in Section 21080.21 of the Public Resources Code, is exempt as long as the project does not exceed one mile.

## WATER RESOURCES POLICY AND COMMUNICATIONS COMMITTEE

### 2024 LEGISLATIVE AND REGULATORY UPDATE

#### SUMMARY:

This report provides an update on the 2023-2024 legislative session, regulatory issues, and IRWD priorities. As legislation and regulations develop, staff will provide updates and recommendations to the Water Resources Policy and Communications Committee and the Board, as appropriate.

Staff recommends the Board consider the following actions / positions:

- *AB 2079 (Bennett) - Groundwater Extraction: Large-Diameter, High-Capacity Wells: Permits: “OPPOSE UNLESS AMENDED”;*
- *AB 2409 (Papan) – OPR Permitting Accountability and Transparency Dashboard: “SEEK AMENDMENTS”;*
- *AB 2533 (Carrillo) – Accessory Dwelling Units: Junior Accessory Dwelling Units: Unpermitted Developments: “WATCH”;*
- *AB 2592 (Grayson) – Local Planning: Housing Elements: Water and Sewer Services: “OPPOSE UNLESS AMENDED”;*
- *AB 2599 (ASM, ESTEM COM.) – Public Beaches & Discontinuation of Residential Water Service: “SUPPORT”;*
- *AB 3121 (Hart) – Water Use: Conservation Orders: “WATCH”;*
- *SB 1110 (Ashby) – Urban Retail Water Suppliers: Informational Conservation Orders: “SUPPORT”;* and
- *SB 1185 (Niello) – Water Conservation- Water Use Objectives: “WATCH”;* and
- *SB 1330 (Archuleta) – Urban Retail Water Supplier Water Use: “WATCH”;*

#### BACKGROUND:

This year, the last day for legislative policy committees to hear fiscal bills is April 26 and May 3 is the policy committee deadline for non-fiscal bills. The last day for fiscal committees to hear and report to the floor any bills introduced in its house is May 18, and the house of origin deadline is May 24. June 27 is the last day for legislative measures to qualify for the November 5, 2024, general election.

A copy of the 2024 Legislative Matrix is attached as Exhibit “A”. Links to the bills discussed below are included within each discussion unless a separate exhibit is noted.

### 2024 State Budget:

The Governor, Senate President Pro Tem, and Assembly Speaker recently announced an agreement that they would work to cut \$12 billion to \$18 billion from the budget deficit through early budget actions. If those level of early budget reductions were taken, the early action would help reduce the state budget shortfall, but a significant shortfall of \$30 to \$50 billion would likely remain.

While the details of the cuts still need to be negotiated and enacted when the Legislature returns from spring recess on April 1, it is anticipated that the Senate will seek early action reductions along the lines of the \$17 billion plan they released in March. It is also expected that the Assembly will develop its own proposal for reductions and release it in early April.

Staff will continue to update the Committee on the discussions taking place around the budget and potential impacts from proposed funding cuts and delays.

### 2024 State Legislative Update:

#### *“Making Conservation a California Way of Life” and Water Efficiency Related Legislation:*

In response to the LAO’s report entitled *“Assessing Early Implementation of Urban Water Use Efficiency Requirements”* and concerns raised by urban water suppliers, members of the Legislature have introduced five bills related to the “Making Conservation a California Way of Life” laws. One of the bills, [AB 2894 \(Gallagher, R-Chico\)](#), is still in spot bill form while the others are now substantial bills. The other four bills are:

- [AB 3121 \(Hart, D-Santa Barbara\) – Conservation Orders](#): AB 3121, authored by Assemblymember Gregg Hart (D, Santa Barbara), would modify the enforcement provisions of the “Making Conservation a California Way of Law.” Currently, the State Water Resources Control Board (State Board), may issue informational orders to an urban retail water supplier that fails to meet its urban water use object by January 1, 2024. The State Board’s enforcement authority increases in 2025, at which point it may issue a written notice to an urban retail water supplier that does not meet its urban water use objection beginning January 1, 2025. Beginning in 2026, the State Board may issue a conservation order to an urban retail water supplier that fails to meet its urban water use object. AB 3121 proposes to move the dates at which the State Board may issue a written notice and a conservation order back one year. Staff recommends that the Board adopt a “watch” position on AB 3121, as the issue of delayed enforcement is already included in the revised implementing regulations recent released by the State Board;
- [SB 1110 \(Ashby, D-Sacramento\) – Conservation Orders](#): Like AB 3121, SB 1110 by Senator Angelique Ashby (D, Sacramento) seeks to change the enforcement authority granted to the State Board for an urban retail water supplier’s failure to meet the urban water use object. Instead of proposing date changes, SB 1110 seeks to add criteria to what the State Board needs to consider before taking an enforcement action against a supplier. Specifically, SB 1110, which is sponsored by the Regional Water Authority, would require the State Board, before deciding whether to issue an informational order,

to consider the lower cost actions the supplier has implemented or will implement to help the water supplier achieve overall water supply resiliency. It would also permit the State Board, before deciding to issue a conservation order, to consider a water supplier's overall water supply management portfolio, including lower cost actions the water supplier has implemented or will implement to help the water supplier achieve overall water supply resiliency. Regional Water Authority has asked IRWD to consider taking a "support" position on SB 1110. Staff recommends that the Board adopt a "support" position on the bill because it would allow the State Board to consider other water supply management factors and cost before taking an enforcement action;

- [SB 1185 \(Niello, R-Roseville\) – Water Conservation- Water Use Objectives](#): SB 1185, authored by Senator Roger Niello (R, Roseville), was amended on March 18 from a spot bill to a bill that would limit the State Board's ability to adopt standards for the Urban Water Use Objective. The bill would prohibit the State Board from adopting efficiency standards more stringent than those recommended by the Department of Water Resources (DWR), would limit any reduction in required water use to a maximum amount of 20 percent, would eliminate water loss from the Urban Water Use Objective and would eliminate thresholds for use of a variance. The bill would also allow for a self certification process for purposes of compliance. Staff recommends that the Board adopt a "watch" position on SB 1185, as the bill is likely not to move forward given the approach it proposes is drastically different for the current approach being implemented by the State Board; and
- [SB 1330 \(Archuleta, D-Norwalk\) – Urban Retail Water Supplier Water Use](#): SB 1330 also proposes substantial changes to the "Making Conservation a California Way of Life" laws. Specifically, SB 1330 would require the State Board to adopt the variances as they were proposed to the Department of Water Resources (DWR) without the level of significance and data reporting currently proposed by the State Board. The bill would also eliminate the need for the State Board to approve the use of a variance; would extend the start dates for the State Board's enforcement authorities; and require DWR to collect and update residential and commercial, industrial and institution landscape data for each supplier every 10 years. Staff recommends that the Board adopt a "watch" position on SB 1330 at this time, as the Senate Natural Resources and Water Committee, the committee to which the bill has been assigned, will likely require substantial amendments to the bill if it is to move forward.

There is also an additional bill tangentially related to the "Making Conservation a California Way of Life" laws. That bill is [AB 2947](#), authored by Assemblymember Lackey (R-Palmdale), that relates to DWR's turf replacement funding program. Staff is monitoring the bill and will report back to the Committee once it is set for hearing or amended.

Staff will also continue to update the Committee on the discussions taking place in Sacramento on the "Making Conservation a California Way of Life" laws.

*Connection Fees and Development Impact Fee Related Bills:*

Once again, Assemblymember Grayson, joined by others, has introduced legislation related to the fees charged on new housing development. For example, Assemblymember Pilar Schiavo (D, Santa Clarita) joined by Assemblymember Tim Grayson (D, Concord) introduced [AB 1820](#). As currently drafted, AB 1820 would permit a development proponent to request a preliminary fee and exaction estimate when it submits an application to a local government.

Senate Scott Wiener (D-San Francisco) also joined by Assemblymember Grayson introduced [SB 937](#). SB 937 seeks to change when fees related to a development are due to a local agency and makes water and sewer connection fees subject to portions of the Mitigation Fee Act.

In addition, Senator Nancy Skinner (D, Oakland) introduced [SB 1210](#) and Assemblymember Joe Patterson (R, Rocklin) introduced [AB 2729](#). SB 1210 would prohibit an electric, gas, sewer, or water service connection fee for new housing construction from exceeding one percent of the reported building permit value of that housing unit. The bill would also require that the connection fee be spread over a period of at least 10 years. AB 2729 would change the point at which a local agency would levy a fee or charge for public improvements on a new residential development.

More recently, Assemblymember Grayson amended [AB 2592](#) on March 19 from a spot bill to a substantive bill. As amended, the bill would expand the existing priority planning for water and sewer service that is typically afforded to lower-income rental housing developments to specific types of housing developments, including those falling under the Starter Home Revitalization Act of 2023. The author's stated intent is to ensure that the supply of entry-level housing can be brought online more expeditiously, and one way to expedite that process is by expanding the existing priority planning for water and sewer service to starter home developments.

The bill would also place a new data collection and reporting obligation on urban water suppliers. AB 2592 would require urban water suppliers to include in their Urban Water Use Management Plan the "projected water use for single-family and multifamily residential housing needed for the proposed housing developments." Staff has reviewed the new data and reporting obligation and does not see an urban water management planning benefit from such reporting, especially when compared to the heavy data collection and evaluation that would be required to complete it.

Another bill that was recently amended was [AB 2533](#), by Assemblymember Juan Carillo (D, Palmdale). AB 2533 would create an amnesty program for unpermitted Accessory Dwelling Units (ADU). With regards to connection fees, the bill would prohibit a local agency from requiring a homeowner to pay impact fees or connection or capacity charges to obtain a permit if they provide evidence that they meet specified criteria for low- or moderate-income households.

Staff has been and will continue to monitor these bills and work to mitigate any impact they may have on IRWD. To position the District to best mitigate any impacts of these bills, the Board previously adopted a "watch" position on AB 1820 and a "seek amendments" position on AB 2729, SB 937, and SB 1210.

In addition to those positions, staff recommends that the Board now adopt a “watch” position on AB 2533 (Carrillo) (note: IRWD does not charge connection fees to ADUs) and an “oppose unless amended” position on AB 2592 with the proposed amends to remove the portions of the bill that relate to Urban Water Management Plans.

Other 2024 State Bills:

*AB 2079 (Bennett) - Groundwater Extraction: Large-Diameter, High-Capacity Wells: Permits:*

The Department of Water Resources (DWR) is sponsoring AB 2079, authored by Assemblymember Steve Bennett (D, Oxnard). The bill, which was previously a spot bill, was substantially amended on March 21. As amended, AB 2079 would generally ban the permitting and approval of large-diameter, high-capacity wells if the well would be within one-quarter mile of a well used for domestic or community water supply, or if the well would be located in an area where subsidence had recently occurred. The bill defines large-diameter, high-capacity wells as being any well with a diameter of more than eight inches and intended to produce two acre-feet or more of water annually.

Staff has reviewed AB 2079 and believes the bill, as currently drafted, could negatively impact groundwater management in California, water banking projects and the District’s ability to site wells. For these reasons, staff recommends the Board adopt a “oppose unless amended” position on AB 2079 allowing staff to seek amendments to the bill to limit its negative impact on the District’s groundwater interests, and seek amendments that would permit wells in managed basins like the Orange County groundwater basins and wells that are part of an approved groundwater bank that is in compliance with CEQA. Staff would also seek amendments to ensure the bill was workable and consistent with the Sustainable Groundwater Management Act’s approach to groundwater management.

*AB 2409 (Papan) - Permitting Accountability and Transparency Dashboard:*

AB 2409, authored by Assembly Water, Parks and Wildlife Committee Chair, Diane Papan (D, San Mateo), and sponsored by the California Municipal Utilities Association, would require the Office of Planning and Research (OPR) to create and maintain a permitting transparency website with a project dashboard showing the status of each state permit for infrastructure projects with an estimated cost of \$100 million or more. The stated purpose of the bill is to increase transparency and accountability for project sponsors with State permitting agencies.

AB 2409 is modeled on the online posting component of the federal FAST Act signed by President Obama in 2015 and aligns with Governor Newsom’s Executive Order N-08-23 on infrastructure streamlining issued in May 2023.

While the author's intent to create transparency on the permitting delays is laudable, the bill may have the unintended potential consequence of increasing reporting obligations for project sponsors. Staff recommends the Board adopt a “seek amendments” position on AB 2409 and authorize staff to work to obtain amendments to the bill that would limit that risk.

*AB 2599 (Committee on Environmental Safety and Toxic Materials) – Public Beaches & Discontinuation of Residential Water Service*

AB 2599 is a bill authored by the Assembly Committee on Environmental Safety and Toxic Materials. The bill cleans up two areas of the California Health and Safety Code. The first is a clarification within Health and Safety Code Section 115885 to allow, on a voluntary basis, local public health officers to use the water quality monitoring data generated by other public agencies when making beach reopening decisions. The second is within Health and Safety Code Section 116920.

Health and Safety Code 116920 is the area of the Health and Safety Code which governs a water supplier's discontinuation of residential water service. Last year, when the final version of [SB 3 \(Dodd, 2023\)](#) was enacted, one of the provisions agreed to by the author, Attorney General's Office, and the Association of California Water Agencies (ACWA) was not included in the enacted bill. AB 2599 seeks to make that negotiated change. It clarifies that the AG can only bring an action, when the laws governing discontinuation of residential water serviced have been violated, in order to obtain an injunction or to restore improperly taken money or real property. This clean up is sponsored and supported by ACWA.

Given the benefit of both of these clarifying clean ups to the Health and Safety Code, staff recommends the Board adopt a "support" position on AB 2599.

Other 2024 State Legislative Updates:
