

The Water Situation


- California water situation is critical
 - Governor's 20% water demand reduction by 2020
- IRWD has diverse water supply
- Water costs will continue to rise
- Proactive property management can keep water bills down
- Demand can be met just by reducing water waste







How Much Water Should this Site Have Used in 2008?



1/3 acre landscape

- 90% shrubs
- 10% turf





Answer: None of the Above!

Site used 2.8 million gallons

It needed only 250,000 gallons

Water wasted = 1 football field with water 9 feet deep







Signs of Overwatering

- HIGH WATER BILLS!!!
- Make sure you review the bills
- Tiered Rates red-flag overwatering

There are Hidden Costs to overwatering
































































































Landscape Bids & Contracts

 Comprehensive contract clearly spells out what is expected

 Water management must be specified in the contract

If you have a site plan....keep it handy

If you don't have a plan....have your landscaper draw a controller chart




























































































































Site Walks









Site Walk Tips

- Walk property every month
 - include landscape superintendant
- Look for signs of overwatering
 - puddles
 - water stains on asphalt & fences
 - constantly wet areas
 - poorly performing plants/overall landscape appearance
- Turn on stations during site walk







How to Improve Your Irrigation Performance

- Use Qualified Irrigation Tech
- Controller upgrades
 - multiple start times
 - multiple programs
 - water budget features
- System upgrades
 - align/adjust existing irrigation heads
 - install efficient irrigation heads
 - pressure regulator

How Much Money Could This Site Have Saved in July 2009 With Proper Water Management?









Answer: None of the Above!

Proper water management would have saved over \$7,600 in 1 month









The Water Bill

- Water usage within allocation = very low rates
 - Conservation \$1.03 per CCF
- Water usage above allocation = progressively higher rates
 - Inefficient \$2.10 per CCF
 - Excessive \$4.19 per CCF
 - Wasteful \$8.37 per CCF

Rates vary for potable or reclaimed and area served






