MINUTES OF REGULAR MEETING – OCTOBER 22, 2012

The regular meeting of the Board of Directors of the Irvine Ranch Water District (IRWD) was called to order at 5:00 p.m. by President Matheis on October 22, 2012 in the District office, 15600 Sand Canyon Avenue, Irvine, California.

Directors Present: LaMar, Matheis, Reinhart, and Swan

Directors Absent: Withers

Also Present: General Manager Cook, Acting Director of Finance/Treasurer Jacobson, Executive Director of Engineering Burton, Executive Director of Water Policy Heiertz, Secretary Bonkowski, Legal Counsel Arneson, Director of Public Affairs Beeman, Director of Water Resources Weghorst, Assistant Secretary Savedra, Mr. Ray Bennett, Ms. Anita Mishook, Ms. Fiona Sanchez, Ms. Shannon Reed, Ms. Kirsten McLaughlin, Mr. Jim Reed, Mr. Bruce Newell and other members of the public and staff.

WRITTEN COMMUNICATION: None.

ORAL COMMUNICATION:

Mrs. Joan Irvine Smith's assistant addressed the Board of Directors with respect to the Dyer Road wellfield. She said it was her understanding that currently wells 4, C-8, C-9, 10, 11, 12, 13, 14, 15, 17 and 18 will operate in accordance with the District's annual pumping plan. Wells 1, 2, 3, 5, 6, 7 and 16 will be off. This was confirmed by Mr. Cook, General Manager of the District.

With respect to the OCWD annexation of certain IRWD lands, on June 5, 2009, IRWD received a letter from OCWD noting that OCWD has completed the formal responses to comments they previously received on the draft program Environmental Impact Report. The letter further noted that with this task completed, OCWD has exercised its right to terminate the 2004 Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) regarding annexation. OCWD also indicated that due to the lack of progress on the annexation issue, the draft program Environmental Impact Report will not be completed. On June 8, 2009, OCWD completed the Long-Term Facilities Plan which was received and filed by the OCWD Board in July 2009. Staff has been coordinating with the City of Anaheim (Anaheim) and Yorba Linda Water District (YLWD) on their most recent annexation requests and has reinitiated the annexation process with OCWD. IRWD, YLWD and Anaheim have negotiated a joint MOU with OCWD to process and conduct environmental analysis of the annexation requests. The MOU was approved by the OCWD Board on July 21, 2010. This was confirmed by Mr. Cook.

With respect to the Groundwater Emergency Service Plan, IRWD has an agreement in place with various south Orange County water agencies, MWDOC and OCWD, to produce additional groundwater for use within IRWD and transfer imported water from IRWD to south Orange County in case of emergencies. IRWD has approved the operating agreement with certain south Orange County water agencies to fund the interconnection facilities needed to affect the

emergency transfer of water. MWDOC and OCWD have also both approved the operating agreement. This was confirmed by Mr. Cook.

PRESENTATION

CALIFORNIA NEVADA SECTION AMERICAN WATER WORKS ASSOCIATION – 2012 OUTSTANDING ENERGY MANAGEMENT AWARD

Mr. Ray Bennett presented to the Board an Energy Management Award received from American Water Works Association recognizing the District for its project to implement an energy plan specifying cost-effective energy projects and reducing greenhouse gas emissions.

MINUTES OF OCTOBER 8, 2012 REGULAR BOARD MEETING

Director Swan made an inquiry on the meeting minutes approved on October 8, 2012, which under the Consent Calendar Item No. 3, included minutes from the September 21, 2012 Adjourned Regular Board meeting. Mr. Swan asked for a recap on the recommendation relative to the item on Bay Delta Conservation Plan Policy Principles in regard to the location of the conveyance intakes. General Manager Cook said that the motion for this item included language that the Bay Delta Conservation Plan should consider positioning the conveyance intakes above the discharge point of the Regional Wastewater Treatment Plant and outside of the tidal zone in order to protect the quality of exported water supplies. There being no further comments, on <u>MOTION</u> by Swan, seconded and unanimously carried, THE MINUTES OF THE OCTOBER 8, 2012 REGULAR BOARD MEETING WERE APPROVED AS PRESENTED.

UPDATES TO EXPENDITURE AUTHORIZATIONS SOURCE OF FUNDS

Regarding source of funding modifications submitted to the Board, Director Swan asked staff to also include the funding amounts. He also commented that large shifts in the Improvement District Allocations Source of Funds shown on Expenditure Authorizations should be reviewed by the Finance and Personnel Committee. There being no further comments, on <u>MOTION</u> by Swan, seconded and unanimously carried, THE BOARD APPROVED UPDATES TO THE EXPENDITURE AUTHORIZATIONS FOR PROJECTS 20910 (1149), 20957 (1221), 21004 (1265), AND 11485 (1646) FROM REGIONAL ALLOCATIONS WITH ENHANCEMENT TO THE CAPITAL REPLACEMENT FUNDS FOR A TOTAL SOURCE OF FUNDING CHANGE IN THE AMOUNT \$742,500.

MICHELSON WATER RECYCLING PLANT PROTECTIVE COATINGS EXPENDITURE AUTHORIZATION

In response to Director Swan's inquiry, Executive Director of Engineering and Planning Burton provided clarification on the color changes which provides for a standardized color, but more importantly, provides for a new application of protective coating on existing facilities at the Michelson Water Recycling Plant. There being no further comments, on <u>MOTION</u> by Swan, seconded and unanimously carried, THE BOARD APPROVED AN EXPENDITURE

AUTHORIZATION IN THE AMOUNT OF \$350,000 FOR THE MICHELSON WATER RECYCLING PLANT PROTECTIVE COATINGS PROJECT NO. 21123 (3799).

SAN JOAQUIN MARSH OUTLET PIPE VALVE REPLACEMENT BUDGET REDUCTION, EXPENDITURE AUTHORIZATION AND CONSTRUCTION AWARD

The San Joaquin Marsh Outlet Pipe Valve Replacement Project will replace the existing hydraulically-operated control valve on the outlet pipe with a motor-operated plug valve. The water in the outlet pipe is turbid and contains silt which is clogging the pilot tubes of the existing control valve requiring daily maintenance. The motor-operated plug valve is not susceptible to clogging and will similarly control the flow through the pipe without daily maintenance. On <u>MOTION</u> by Swan, seconded and unanimously carried, THE BOARD APPROVED A BUDGET REDUCTION IN THE AMOUNT OF \$1,067,000 FOR PROJECT 10835 (1853); APPROVED AN EXPENDITURE AUTHORIZATION IN THE AMOUNT OF \$374,000 FOR PROJECT 10835 (1853); AND AUTHORIZED THE GENERAL MANAGER TO EXECUTE A CONTRACT WITH GCI CONSTRUCTION, INC. IN THE AMOUNT OF \$134,200 FOR THE SAN JOAQUIN MARSH OUTLET PIPE VALVE REPLACEMENT PROJECT.

AUTOMATION SUPPORT CONSULTANT SERVICES

Executive Director of Engineering and Planning Burton reported that the District's automation staff consists of a small group of instrumentation and controls engineers, field technicians, and specialists and is responsible for keeping the hardware and software automation systems fully operational on a continuous basis, allowing the District to operate its water and wastewater facilities remotely with minimal after hours support. In addition to the ongoing operation and maintenance of the District's automation systems, this group is also responsible for the design, construction support, and commissioning of the automation systems required for all capital projects. Mr. Burton said that traditionally, staff in the automation group has been able to support the District's capital projects with in-house personnel and occasional support from consulting firms; however, due to the unprecedented number of large and complex capital projects underway for the past several years, staff has increased its use of automation consultants. He said due to many different considerations ranging from project scope additions, design and construction issues, extended project schedules, overlapping deadlines, and project complexities, staff recognizes that continued consultant support for the next six months will be required to complete these projects in accordance with their respective project schedule requirements.

Mr. Burton said that staff has reviewed the workload projections and recommends that variances for additional automation services be approved for two of the current automation consulting firms: HDR Engineering and Malcolm Pirnie/Arcadis. He said that staff also recommends that two additional consulting firms, Westin Engineering and Vertech Industrial Systems, be selected to provide specialized automation support services that are not being provided by any firms currently under contract. Staff identified key individuals at these two consulting firms as being highly qualified.

Director Reinhart reported that this item was reviewed and approved by the Engineering and Operations Committee on October 16, 2012. On <u>MOTION</u> by Reinhart, seconded and unanimously carried, THE BOARD APPROVED VARIANCE NO. 1 TO THE PROFESSIONAL SERVICES AGREEMENT WITH HDR ENGINEERING IN THE

AMOUNT OF \$132,100; APPROVED VARIANCE NO. 1 TO THE PROFESSIONAL SERVICES AGREEMENT WITH MALCOLM PIRNIE/ARCADIS IN THE AMOUNT OF \$142,300; AND AUTHORIZED THE GENERAL MANAGER TO EXECUTE A PROFESSIONAL SERVICES AGREEMENT WITH WESTIN ENGINEERING IN THE AMOUNT OF \$90,000; AND VERTECH INDUSTRIAL SYSTEMS IN THE AMOUNT OF \$86,360.

ORANGE PARK ACRES WELL NO. 1 WELLHEAD DESIGN CONSULTANT SELECTION

General Manager Cook reported that a Professional Services Agreement was executed with Kennedy/Jenks (K/J) in April 2011 to prepare a basis of design report and construction documents, and to provide construction phase services for the OPA-1 wellhead and disinfection facilities. Mr. Cook said that as K/J developed the hydraulic calculations, it was determined that the project would need to include provisions to address the high discharge pressure that would be encountered at the wellhead. After a review of several alternatives, K/J recommended a dual pumping system that included a wellhead pump that feeds an on-site wet well and a booster pump that feeds the Zone 5 distribution system. He further said that as the recommended project substantially differed from the project that was originally scoped, staff decided to solicit proposals for the final design of the recommended facilities.

Executive Director of Engineering and Planning Burton said that staff received proposals from four firms: K/J, Lee & Ro, Tetra Tech, and URS. Brown & Caldwell declined to submit a proposal due to concerns with meeting the design schedule. Mr. Burton said that staff recommends that URS be awarded the Professional Services Agreement since its design approach, schedule, and man-hours are consistent with the project goals. He said that URS's proposal presented new ideas for noise control, and for the building design to improve constructability and accessibility.

Director Reinhart reported that this item was reviewed and approved by the Engineering and Operations Committee on October 16, 2012. In respond to Director Swan's inquiry, Mr. Burton said that there will be provisions in the design to accommodate a second well if required in the future. There being no further comments, on <u>MOTION</u> by Reinhart, seconded and unanimously carried, THE BOARD APPROVED AN EXPENDITURE AUTHORIZATION FOR PROJECT 11405 (1250) IN THE AMOUNT OF \$399,000, AND AUTHORIZED THE GENERAL MANAGER TO EXECUTE A PROFESSIONAL SERVICES AGREEMENT IN THE AMOUNT OF \$492,866 WITH URS CORPORATION FOR ENGINEERING SERVICES FOR THE OPA-1 WELLHEAD DESIGN, PROJECT 11405 (1250).

<u>APPROVAL OF SUPPLEMENTAL ENVIRONMENTAL IMPACT REPORT FOR THE</u> <u>MICHELSON WATER RECYCLING PLANT PHASE 2 AND 3 CAPACITY EXPANSION</u> <u>PROJECT – BIOSOLIDS HANDLING COMPONENT</u>

General Manager Cook reported that IRWD, as Lead Agency, has prepared a Final Supplemental Environmental Impact Report (Final SEIR) for the Michelson Water Recycling Plant Phases 2 and 3 Capacity Expansion Project, Biosolids Handling Component. These actions are necessary for IRWD to complete the steps required under the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA). Using a PowerPoint presentation, Director of Water Resources Weghorst provided an overview of the project objectives and benefits which include: 1) meeting future biosolids handling needs of the Michelson Water Recycling Plant (MWRP) and the Los Alisos Water Recycling Plant (LAWRP); 2) providing for greater control of biosolids management at reduced costs; 3) allowing beneficial use of biosolids and biogases produced during the treatment process; 4) minimizing environmental impacts associated with biosolids management; and 5) making efficient and sustainable use of renewal resources.

Mr. We horst then reviewed the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) process noting that a Notice of Preparation circulated on March 28, 2011, a scoping meeting was held on April 12, 2011, and the comment period closed on April 26, 2011. He said that the Draft SEIR circulated for a 45-day review on July 3, 2012 during which time a public meeting was held on July 24, 2012 along with additional public outreach meetings. The comment period was also extended 15 additional days at the request of the University Synagogue with the comment period closing on August 31, 2012. Responses to comments were distributed on October 11, 2012. He said that additional public outreach meetings were held with the City of Irvine on several occasions, the City of Newport Beach, two meetings with the University Synagogue, LBA Realty, Watermarke Community Association, 300 Plaza Homeowners' Association, Sea and Sage Audubon, and the South Coast Air Quality Management District, all of which were very constructive as they all presented all of their concerns. He further said that commenting agencies/interested parties included the Native American Heritage Commission, Department of Toxic Substances Control, Airport Land Use Commission, University Synagogue, Department of Transportation, Orange County Public Works, LBA Realty, County of Orange Health Care Agency, Orange County Sanitation District, Department of Resources Recycling and Recovery, University of California, Irvine, South Coast Air Quality Management District, City of Irvine, Sea and Sage Audubon, and US Fish and Wildlife Service.

Mr. Weghorst provided an overview of the significant public comments received which included:

- The City of Irvine requested 1) a third-party review by the City of Mesa, Arizona (*IRWD* hired Dudek to conduct a peer review of the project); 2) that the SEIR show heights of surrounding properties relative to the project (of which *IRWD* prepared a simulation on how the project would look from the background buildings); and recommended 3) vegetative screening along Harvard Avenue (which is now included in the landscape plan);
- University Synagogue expressed concern regarding 1) the potential for objectionable odors that could be detected beyond the MWRP boundary (of which staff assured them that the project would preclude odors from being detected beyond the project's boundaries); 2) that the project may be visible from the Synagogue (of which staff provided them a copy of the landscape plan that would include screenings to soften the appearance of the proposes facilities); 3) that the project could devalue its property; 4) that IRWD Operations has no experience with such facilities (all operations staff will be trained and appropriately certified); and requested 5) a landscaping plan solution (staff provided photo simulations which included vegetation and landscaping); 6) a third-party operational review panel that would serve as a liaison between the community and IRWD (staff will hold quarterly public outreach meetings to review new information and to handle any issues or concerns); and 7) that IRWD underwrite a field trip to the City of Mesa's facility).

• LBA Realty's expressed concern regarding elevated views of the construction staging area (which was evaluated by Dudek, the District's consultant).

Mr. Weghorst said that all of the District's responses above (in italics) have been further detailed in the responses to comments and incorporated as needed in the findings. Director Reinhart suggested that the proposed public outreach meetings could be held as needed and not necessarily quarterly if no developments are occurring in which anyone is interested. Director LaMar said that he had reviewed all of the comment letters, and a principal concern was odor, which has been thoroughly addressed, and he was looking forward to moving ahead on this project. Ms. Anita Mishook, Executive Vice President of the University Synagogue, said she was deeply appreciative of all of the efforts by staff who went to extraordinary efforts to respond to all of their concerns. Director Swan said that he reviewed all of the comments and believes appropriate responses were made. SUMMARY:

Construction of the Orange Park Acres Domestic Water Transmission Main Project is complete. The Contractor, Leatherwood Construction, Inc., has completed the required work and all punch list items. The project has received final inspection and acceptance of construction is recommended.

BACKGROUND:

The Orange Park Acres Domestic Water Transmission Main Project was advertised in August 2010, and was designed to replace the existing 16-inch riveted steel transmission main constructed in 1929 by the former Orange Park Acres Mutual Water Company. The existing transmission main had experienced several leaks before the project began. The new transmission main connects the Orange Park Acres service area to the Zone 5 pressure system at Chapman and Jamboree and to the new well site at Gravier and Bond. Approximately 26,500 linear feet of 6-inch to 20-inch diameter piping was installed, two pressure reducing stations constructed, and over 500,000 square feet of paving was placed. Construction is complete and the project is ready for final acceptance by the Board.

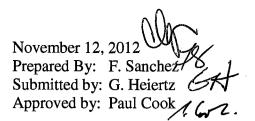

THIRTEENTH AMENDMENT TO AGREEMENT FOR PARTICIPATION IN SPECIFIED MUNICIPAL WATER <u>DISTRICT OF ORANGE COUNTY REBATE PROGRAMS</u>

SUMMARY:

The Water Conservation Business Plan (Plan) included a "Tactical Incentives" element to encourage customers to install water conservation devices. Incentive payments are based on the water and wastewater systems avoided costs for each device and are therefore cost-effective for IRWD. As a result of a recent change by Metropolitan Water District transitioning to a new program administrator for the non-residential program, a large number of old applications have recently been processed. This has depleted IRWD's matching funds for FY 2012-13 much more quickly than otherwise would have occurred. Therefore, staff proposes adding \$100,000 in funding for this fiscal year to the non-residential program in order to minimize disruptions to customers. Staff recommends that the Board authorize the General Manager to execute the 13th Amendment to the existing Agreement with the Municipal Water District of Orange County (MWDOC) to increase the Tactical Incentive funding for FY 2012-13 by \$100,000.

BACKGROUND:

Tactical Incentives are one of the key elements of IRWD's Water Use Efficiency Program. The Tactical Incentives are cost-effective financial incentives provided by IRWD to supplement existing regional rebate programs administered by either Metropolitan Water District of Southern California (MWD) and/or the Municipal Water District of Orange County (MWDOC). The incentives are based on IRWD's calculated avoided costs resulting from the installation of the various conservation devices.

The current program is operating under a Twelfth Amendment to the Agreement for Participation and Co-funding by Irvine Ranch Water District in Specified Municipal Water District of Orange County Rebate Programs. IRWD's total budget for Tactical Incentives in FY 2012-13 is \$450,000, of which \$350,000 is allocated to residential customers and \$100,000 allocated to non-residential customers. Staff proposes executing a Thirteenth Amendment, Exhibit "A", to the existing Agreement to add \$100,000 in funding to the non-residential program for FY 2012-13. This is a result of MWD's switch to a new rebate administrator for non-residential customers effective October 1, 2012. The transition led to a large volume of backlogged applications, some dating back to 2011, recently being processed and this has depleted IRWD's FY 2012-13 funding for nonresidential customers much more quickly than anticipated. Although IRWD originally allocated funding for the old applications when they were first submitted, MWD does not roll-over funding from one year to the next, and therefore they are all being paid from IRWD's FY 2012-13 budget. This amendment will ensure continued operation of the program and minimize disruptions for IRWD customers. This Thirteenth Amendment ("Amendment") to the existing "Agreement for Participation and Co-Funding by Irvine Ranch Water District in Specified Municipal Water District of Orange County Rebate Programs" ("Agreement") is entered into by and between the Municipal Water District of Orange County ("MWDOC") and Irvine Ranch Water District ("IRWD"). The Agreement provides for participation and co-funding by IRWD of residential and commercial water use efficiency devices through Metropolitan Water District of Southern California's ("Metropolitan") SoCal Water\$mart ("SoCal Water\$mart") residential and commercial rebate programs in IRWD's service area.

This Amendment modifies the Agreement, which includes without limitation all previous amendments and attachments. Except as stated below, this Amendment is effective November 1, 2012, and the Agreement, as amended hereby, remains in full force and effect.

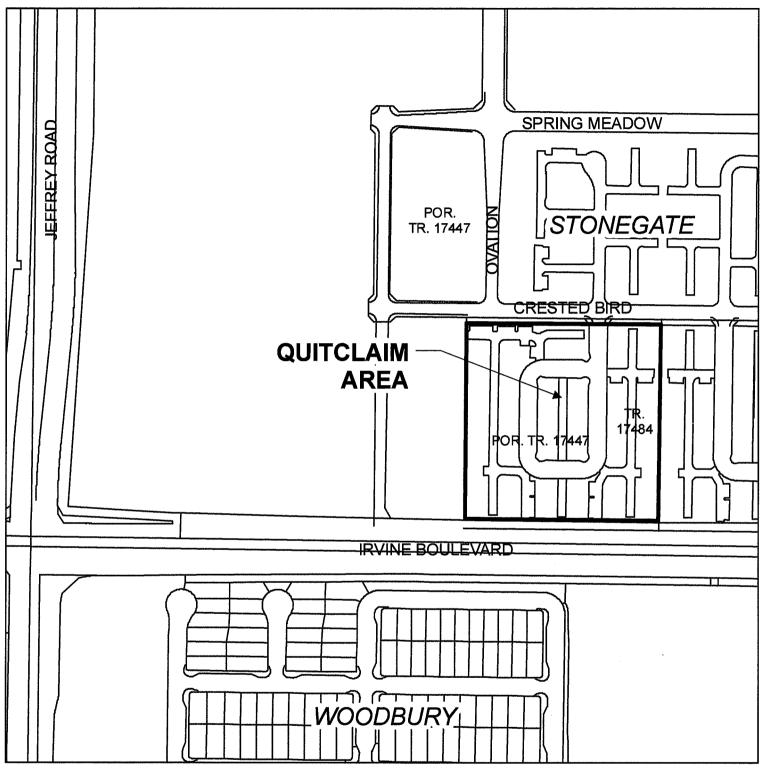

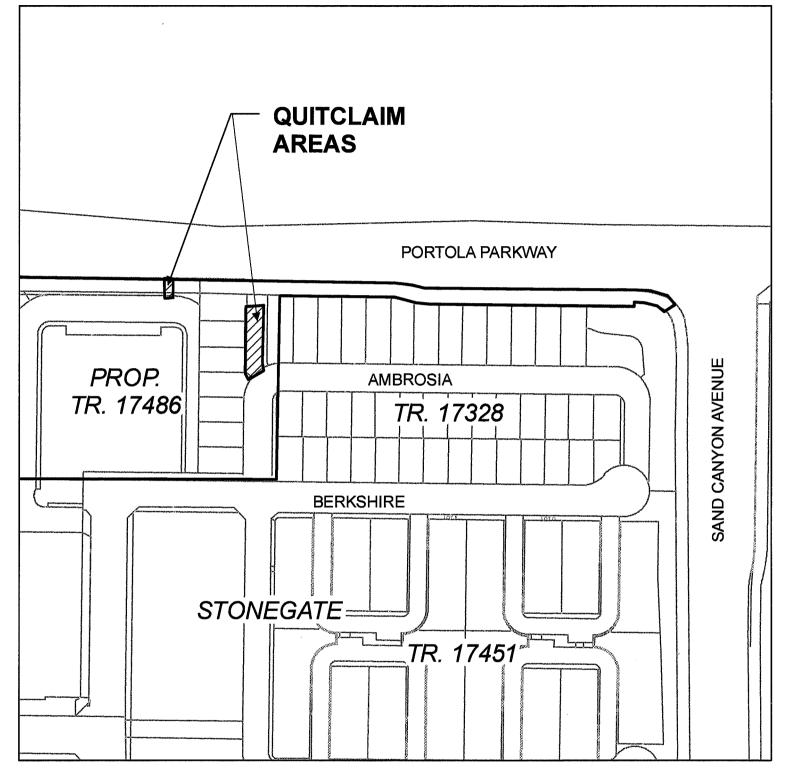

PROPOSED DECREASES TO CALPERS EMPLOYER PAID MEMBER CONTRIBUTIONS (EPMC)

SUMMARY:

As part of the multi-year process to transition employees to paying the full 8% of the CalPERS employee contribution, increases in the employee contribution rates are proposed as follows:

- Effective March 1, 2013, all Full-time Regular Employees will pay an additional 1% into CalPERS, decreasing the EPMC from 3% to 2% and increasing the employee contributions from 5% to 6%, and
- Effective March 1, 2013, all Department Directors and Executive Directors (Senior Management) will pay an additional 1% into CalPERS, decreasing the EPMC from 1% to 0% and increasing the employee contributions from 7% to the full 8%.

The General Manager and the (vacant) Assistant General Manager positions (defined as Executive Management) have been paying the full 8% since March 1, 2012.

Staff recommends the Board approve the decrease to EPMC for Full-time Regular Employees and Senior Management as outlined above and adopt the required resolutions indicating the change in the EPMC.

BACKGROUND:

During the review of the Operating Budget for Fiscal Year 2011-12, opportunities to manage costs associated with the current IRWD employee pension program were identified. On April 25, 2011, a multi-year process was implemented that would eventually transition all of the District's employees to paying the full 8% of the CalPERS employee contribution. The following adjustments of employee-paid contributions have already been implemented:

- Effective July 1, 2011, CalPERS employee contributions for Executive Management increased from 1% to 6%; Senior Management employee contributions increased from 1% to 5%; and all other Full-time Regular Employee contributions increased from 1% to 3%. All Full-time Regular Employee positions and the Senior Management positions also received a 2% increase in salary effective July 1, 2011.
- Effective March 1, 2012, CalPERS employee contributions for Executive Management increased from 6% to 8%; Senior Management employee contributions increased from 5% to 7%; and all other Full-time Regular Employee contributions increased from 3% to 5%.

Action Calendar – Proposed Decreases to CalPERS Employer Paid Member Contributions (EPMC) November 12, 2012 Page 2

Shifts in Employee Paid Contributions Effective March 2, 2013:

At its meeting on September 24, 2012 and in conjunction with the signing of the Memorandum of Understanding between the IRWD Employees Association (IRWDEA) and IRWD, the Board agreed to decrease EPMC as described above, effective with the first pay period in March 2013 (March 2, 2013). For the Board to make the adjustments to the EPMC to CalPERS, it needs to adopt resolutions stipulating the specific amount of each adjustment. The resolutions associated with these adjustments are attached as Exhibit "A".

FISCAL IMPACTS:

During the budgetary process, staff projected a reduction in EPMC for Senior Management of 1% and for Full-Time Regular employees of 1.5%. This was expected to reduce the monthly EPMC for the last four months of the fiscal year by approximately \$20,000 per month, resulting in a total annual budget for EPMC of \$683,000. As a result of shifting only 1% of EPMC for Full-time Regular employees, for the last four months of the fiscal year, EPMC will only be reduced by approximately \$14,000 per month. Therefore, the projected annual cost for EPMC for FY 2012-13 will be approximately \$24,000 (3.5%) over budget.

ENVIRONMENTAL COMPLIANCE:

PROPOSED CONSUMER PRICE INDEX CHANGES TO SALARY GRADE SCHEDULE AND EMPLOYEE COST OF LIVING ADJUSTMENTS

SUMMARY:

The Bureau of Labor Statistics has released the Consumer Price Index (CPI) for the one-year period ending September 2012, which reflects a 2.18% increase from September 2011 to September 2012. Staff requests that the Board:

- Approve an increase to the Salary Range Schedule; and
- Approve a Cost of Living Adjustment (COLA) of 2.18% for eligible employees.

BACKGROUND:

On January 18, 1999, the Board of Directors approved the separation of the COLA component from the overall employee merit increase. Each year, staff recommends changes to the Salary Grade Schedule and employee cost of living adjustments based on a September to September comparison of the CPI for the Orange-Riverside-Los Angeles All Urban Consumers. The COLA adjustments are made effective December 1 of each year. This item implements the COLA to be effective December 1, 2012 and was included in the Memorandum of Understanding between IRWD Employees Association (IRWDEA) and IRWD, dated September 24, 2012.

Salary Grade Schedule Changes:

The salary grade ranges were last adjusted December 1, 2011. This change was based on the Board-approved COLA.

Attached as Exhibit "B-1" is the Consumer Price Index information for September 2011 and September 2012, reflecting a change in CPI from 233.022 to 238.104, or 2.18%. Exhibit "B-2" reflects the calculation of the COLA. The impact to the salary grade schedule is detailed in Exhibit "C".

FISCAL IMPACTS:

During the budgetary process, staff included a 1.2% or approximately \$319,700 increase in salaries for COLA for FY 2012-13. Actual funds needed to implement a 2.18% increase for the last seven months of the fiscal year will be approximately \$321,700. Therefore, the projected annual cost for FY 2012-13 for COLA will be approximately \$2,000 (0.006%) over budget.

ADDITIONAL CONTRIBUTIONS FOR FY 2012-13 TO THE CALIFORNIA PUBLIC EMPLOYEES RETIREMENT SYSTEM

SUMMARY:

Staff requests that the Board approve an additional contribution not to exceed a total of \$5,000,000 to California Public Employees Retirement System (CalPERS) during the fiscal year 2012-13, with the timing and amount of the additional contributions delegated to the Finance and Personnel Committee. The ability to make additional contributions is consistent with the District's policy principles to strategically reduce the District's actuarially-determined unfunded liability.

BACKGROUND:

CalPERS required employer contributions can be made in two ways: (1) a lump sum payment option made between July 1 and July 15 of the beginning of the new fiscal year; or (2) making payments based on each semi-monthly payroll total based on a payroll percentage established annually by CalPERS's actuaries. The IRWD Operating Budget for FY 2012-13 included \$4,210,300 for the CalPERS employer contribution rate and included an additional contribution of approximately \$2,328,000 (paid quarterly) to reduce the District's unfunded liability.

Additional contributions in excess of the District's employer contribution rate can be made during the fiscal year at the discretion of the District. In addition to the previously approved CalPERS contributions for FY 2012-13, staff recommends that the District make an excess contribution(s) not to exceed a total of \$5,000,000 to CalPERS during the fiscal year 2012-13, with the timing and amount of additional contributions delegated to the Finance and Personnel Committee. The opportunity to make additional contributions is consistent with the District's policy principles to strategically reduce its actuarially-determined unfunded liability, and would be determined based on consideration of the District's liquidity and expected cash flow needs.

Additional contributions to reduce the District's unfunded liability is consistent with previous years when excess contributions have been made based on expected liquidity and cash flow expectations. Beginning in FY 2008-09, the District has made additional contributions in excess of its annual required contribution totaling approximately \$11.6 million.

FISCAL IMPACTS:

Excess contribution(s) to the California Public Employees Retirement System would be reflected as a loan from the District's Replacement Fund.

INDEMNIFICATION AND REIMBURSEMENT AGREEMENT WITH DUDLEY RIDGE WATER DISTRICT

SUMMARY:

The District has been working with Dudley Ridge Water District (DRWD) on developing a longterm unbalanced exchange program that would allow IRWD to store State Water Project (SWP) water allocated to Jackson Ranch in IRWD's Strand Ranch Integrated Banking Project in Kern County (Exchange Program). Staff recommends that the Board approve an Indemnification and Reimbursement Agreement between IRWD and DRWD and authorize the General Manager to concur with the unbalanced exchange terms per the proposed letter to the California Department of Water Resources (DWR).

BACKGROUND:

On January 25, 2010, the Board of Directors authorized the purchase of the Jackson Ranch located in the DRWD service area. The purchase included 883.26 acres of land, Kern Water Bank participation rights, stored water and the right to use 1,748 acre-feet of SWP Table A water that is allocated to the land in accordance with the DRWD's Rules and Regulations. It is IRWD's intention to deliver the Table A water allotted to the Jackson Ranch to the Strand Ranch Integrated Banking Project (Water Bank) for storage on an unbalanced exchange basis.

On July 19, 2012, staff presented proposed terms for an Exchange Program with DRWD and the Committee authorized staff and legal counsel to work with DRWD to finalize the terms for the proposed Exchange Program and prepare a letter agreement incorporating the proposed terms for further consideration by the Committee and Board. The proposed terms for the Exchange Program provide for IRWD to store up to 8,700 acre-feet of the Jackson Ranch SWP supplies in the Water Bank over the next five years on an unbalanced exchange basis. One-half of the delivered water would be returned to Jackson Ranch within ten years as required by DWR. During years when Table A water is being delivered to the Water Bank, irrigation of areas at the Jackson Ranch that are still being farmed would occur using water from storage in IRWD's account in the Kern Water Bank.

The terms for the proposed Exchange Program were presented at the DRWD Board meeting on October 10, 2012. After discussion of the program, DRWD determined that the Exchange Program as proposed is consistent with DRWD's Rules and Regulations and that a separate agreement would not be necessary to implement the program. DRWD will facilitate the implementation of the proposed program through DWR contingent upon the execution of an Indemnification and Reimbursement Agreement with IRWD.

Indemnification and Reimbursement Agreement:

In order to not impact or incur any costs to other DRWD landowners, DRWD has requested that an Indemnification and Reimbursement Agreement be executed. This agreement includes a provision for IRWD to reimburse DRWD for all costs incurred by DRWD related to the Exchange Program. These DRWD costs are not expected to be significant. Staff and IRWD legal counsel assisted in the preparation of the agreement that is attached as Exhibit "A". Staff recommends that the Board authorize the General Manager to execute this agreement with DRWD, subject to non-substantive changes.

MWD Consent:

Metropolitan Water District of Southern California's (MWD) consent of the proposed Exchange Program is needed for IRWD to secure SWP and have it delivered by exchange into IRWD's service area. Through MWD's consent, MWD will act on IRWD's behalf as the exchangee under the terms of the existing Coordinated Operating, Water Storage, Exchange and Delivery Agreement (MWD Agreement). As the exchangee for IRWD's SWP water transactions, MWD has the right to decide whether the IRWD-secured SWP water is delivered into storage at the Water Bank or to MWD's reservoirs in Southern California. If the water is stored in Southern California, MWD would ensure that 50 percent of the water is returned to DRWD within ten years as required by DWR.

Letter to DWR:

In order to facilitate the Exchange Program, DRWD will follow the procedures that it uses for implementing exchange programs for other DRWD land owners. This procedure minimizes DRWD and DWR costs to process and administer annual delivery requests. DRWD with the assistance of IRWD staff has prepared a letter to DWR requesting a State Water Contractors review of the program with a follow up recommendation to DWR to develop the long-term agreements needed to approve the program. This letter to DWR is attached as Exhibit "B" and includes the terms for the proposed Exchange Program and includes signature blocks for IRWD's concurrence and MWD's consent. DWR will prepare exchange and delivery agreements for the program which will be similar to those prepared for IRWD's Pilot Exchange Programs with Antelope East-Kern Water Agency and the Central Coast Water Authority. Staff is requesting that the Board authorize the General Manager's concurrence with the unbalanced exchange terms per the letter to the DWR, subject to non-substantive changes.

FISCAL IMPACTS:

The unit cost of SWP water to IRWD's service area resulting from the proposed Exchange Program and the cost of returning half the water back to the Jackson Ranch for irrigation under a farm lease arrangement is presented in Exhibit "C". If MWD opts to store the water in its Southern California reservoirs, then the cost of water at IRWD's service area will be \$929 per acre-foot. If the water is stored in the Water Bank, then the estimated cost to IRWD's service area will be \$983 per acre-foot for water recovered by exchange and \$1,043 per acre-foot for water recovered by pumping groundwater wells. Consistent with the MWD Agreement, all water stored, recovered and delivered into IRWD's service area from the IRWD/DRWD Exchange Program will be treated as extraordinary supply during periods of an MWD Water Supply Allocation. The cost of water to be delivered to IRWD from the proposed Exchange Program is expected to break even with MWD's Full Service Tier-2 rate within a few years. Currently the Tier-2 rate is \$920 per acre-foot and the MWD Allocation plan Penalty rate is \$2,634 per acre-foot.

The cost of water returned to the Jackson Ranch for future irrigation by a farm lease will range from \$157 to \$271 per acre-foot depending on where MWD opts to store the water and how the water is to be recovered from the Water Bank. Additional costs may be assigned to the lease for the recovery of IRWD's cost of the purchase of the SWP Table A allotment associated with the Jackson Ranch.

ENVIRONMENTAL COMPLIANCE:

An Initial Study/Negative Declaration for the IRWD Jackson Ranch Water Allocation Project was prepared and circulated for public review in compliance with the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA). A Notice of Determination for the final Negative Declaration for the Project was filed by IRWD on January 14, 2010, and by DRWD on January 20, 2010. The Negative Declaration evaluated the delivery of IRWD's SWP Table A water from the Jackson Ranch to the Water Bank.

A Final Environmental Impact Report (FEIR) for the Strand Ranch Integrated Water Banking Project was prepared, approved, and certified in compliance with CEQA. The FEIR evaluated the delivery of SWP water to the Strand Ranch Integrated Water Banking Project and to IRWD's service area through MWD's facilities.

RECOMMENDATION:

THAT THE BOARD AUTHORIZE THE GENERAL MANAGER TO EXECUTE THE INDEMNIFICATION AND REIMBURSEMENT AGREEMENT BETWEEN IRVINE RANCH WATER DISTRICT AND DUDLEY RIDGE WATER DISTRICT AND AUTHORIZE THE GENERAL MANAGER TO CONCUR WITH THE UNBALANCED EXCHANGE TERMS PER THE LETTER TO THE DEPARTMENT OF WATER RESOURCES, BOTH SUBJECT TO NON-SUBSTANTIVE CHANGES.

EXHIBIT "A"

INDEMNIFICATION AGREEMENT

THIS AGREEMENT is made effective as of October _____ 2012 by and between the Dudley Ridge Water District, a California water district ("DRWD") and the Irvine Ranch Water District, a California water district ("IRWD"), with reference to the following facts:

A. DRWD holds a long-term Water Supply Contract with the California Department of Water Resources pursuant to which it is entitled to receive certain quantities of water from the State Water Project ("SWP").

B. IRWD is a landowner in DRWD and wishes to transfer up to 8,700 acre feet of the SWP water allocated to IRWD's land in DRWD between 2013 and 2017 (inclusive) for delivery to IRWD's Strand Ranch Integrated Banking Project. At least 50% of the SWP water so delivered to such Project, less reasonable losses, will be returned to DRWD for use on IRWD's lands in DRWD by 2022, while the balance of that water will be delivered for use within IRWD. The foregoing arrangement is referred to below as the "Exchange."

C. DRWD has determined that the Exchange is consistent with DRWD policy and has agreed to facilitate the Exchange. However, DRWD wishes to ensure that costs incurred by DRWD for the benefit of IRWD in connection with the Exchange are borne solely by IRWD so as not to spread those costs to other DRWD landowners.

THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual terms, conditions and covenants set forth below, the parties agree as follows:

1. Indemnification. In consideration for DRWD's agreement to facilitate the Exchange, IRWD shall indemnify, defend and hold DRWD and its directors, officers, employees, agents, attorneys and consultants free and harmless from and against any and all loss, cost, litigation, expense or claims, including without limitation attorneys' fees and costs (collectively, "Claims") incurred by any of them directly or indirectly resulting from any actions undertaken by or on behalf of DRWD in connection with the Exchange, any environmental compliance performed or not performed by DRWD in connection with the Exchange, or otherwise relating in any way to the Exchange, except to the extent a Claim is the direct result of the willful misconduct of the party that would otherwise be indemnified.

2. <u>DRWD Out of Pocket Costs</u>. Without limiting the generality of Section 1 of this Agreement in any way, IRWD shall pay or reimburse DRWD for all expenses and costs incurred by DRWD in connection with activities undertaken by DRWD relating to the Exchange, whether at IRWD's request, as required by law or DRWD policy, or as otherwise determined to be appropriate by DRWD's Manager-Engineer. The expenses to be paid or reimbursed by IRWD include without limitation (i) actual out-of-pocket expenses incurred by DRWD (but not costs of DRWD staff), (ii) the actual amount of legal fees, consulting fees and similar third-party charges incurred by DRWD for the benefit of IRWD in connection with the Exchange, including without limitation the costs incurred by DRWD in connection with preparing any environmental documentation, (iii) all costs of litigation (including without limitation attorneys' fees) actually incurred by DRWD in defending any action brought as the result of or challenging DRWD's actions in connection with the Exchange, and (v) damages actually payable by DRWD relating to any activities DRWD undertakes in connection with the Exchange, except to the extent such damages are the direct result of the willful misconduct of DRWD. 3. <u>Entire Agreement</u>. This Agreement constitutes the entire agreement between the IRWD and DRWD with respect to the subject matter hereof. This Agreement supersedes all prior negotiations, discussions, contracts, agreements or understandings between the parties hereto, and no evidence of any prior or contemporaneous parol agreement or understanding shall be admissible to vary its terms. The foregoing notwithstanding, this Agreement shall not supersede the Agreement Between Dudley Ridge Water District and Irvine Ranch Water District, dated February 25, 2010. This Agreement shall not be amended or modified in any way except by a written instrument executed by each party hereto.

4. <u>Interpretation</u>. It is agreed and acknowledged by the parties that this Agreement has been arrived at through negotiation involving their respective counsel, and that each party has had a full and fair opportunity to revise the terms of this Agreement. Consequently, the normal rule of construction that any ambiguities are to be resolved against the drafting party shall not apply in construing or interpreting this Agreement.

5. <u>Cumulative Rights: Waiver</u>. No failure by either party to exercise, and no delay in exercising any rights, shall be construed or deemed to be a waiver thereof, nor shall any single or partial exercise by either party preclude any other or future exercise thereof or the exercise of any other right. Any waiver of any provision or of any breach of any provision of this Agreement must be in writing, and any waiver by either party of any breach of any provision or of any breach of any provision or of any breach of this Agreement shall not operate as or be construed to be a waiver of any other breach of that provision or of any breach of any other provision of this Agreement.

6. <u>Attorneys' Fees</u>. Should any litigation be commenced between the parties concerning this Agreement, or the rights and duties of any of them in relation thereto, the party prevailing in such litigation shall be entitled, in addition to such other relief as may be granted, to recover its attorneys' fees and other costs of litigation as determined by the court or in a separate action brought for that purpose.

7. <u>Choice of Laws; Venue</u>. This Agreement shall be governed and construed in accordance with the laws of the State of California. Venue for any action brought for the purpose of enforcing any provision of this Agreement shall be brought only in Kings County, California.

8. <u>Severability</u>. In the event any of the terms or provisions of this Agreement shall be held to be invalid, then any such invalidity shall not affect any other term of provision contained herein, which terms and provisions shall remain in full force and effect, and the invalid terms or provisions shall be deemed reformed to be valid to the maximum extent permitted by law.

9. <u>Counterparts</u>. This Agreement may be executed in counterparts.

On behalf of Dudley Ridge Water District ("DRWD"), Irvine Ranch Water District ("IRWD"), and Metropolitan Water District of Southern California ("MWDSC"), I am providing the Department of Water Resources ("DWR") this letter and enclosures describing a proposed multi-year 2 for 1 exchange. IRWD is a landowner in DRWD that has banking facilities in Kern County¹, a Coordinated Operating, Water Storage, Exchange and Delivery Agreement with MWDSC (Coordinated Operating Agreement)² and demands within the IRWD service area located inside MWDSC. The purpose of this letter is to request DWR's approval of the water exchange program as presented. By their concurrence and consent below, both IRWD and MWDSC are in support of the proposed exchange.

Basically, the proposed exchange would deliver all or a portion of IRWD's allocated DRWD SWP water to IRWD's Strand Ranch Integrated Banking Project (Water Bank) or, at MWDSC's option, to MWDSC storage facilities in Southern California in accordance with the Coordinated Operating Agreement. Accordingly, Kern County Water Agency ("KCWA") would be a party to the DWR approval agreement in that water would be delivered into KCWA's service area when water is stored in the Water Bank. Through the Coordinated Operating Agreement, 50% of the DRWD water (less proportional losses) would be used inside of MWDSC within IRWD's service area and the remaining 50% (less proportional losses) will be returned for IRWD's use within DRWD. Up to 8,700 acre-feet would be delivered from DRWD over the five year period from 2013-2017; the portion of the water to be returned to DRWD would be returned by 2022.

The proposed exchange is consistent with DRWD's policy for temporary transfers that allows "Non District-approved banking or exchange programs where at least 50% of the water (after reasonable losses) is returned to the District within a ten year period, or other period as allowed by the California Department of Water Resources." Furthermore, the exchange as described is

consistent with the IRWD's CEQA documentation for the Strand Ranch Integrated Banking Project (CEQA certified 5/27/2008) and CEQA for the IRWD Jackson Ranch Water Allocation Project (NOD filed 1/14/2010 by IRWD and 1/20/2010 by DRWD). The later document specifically describes this 2 for 1, unbalanced exchange among the parties indicated (DRWD, KCWA, IRWD, and MWDSC).

By copy of this letter to the State Water Contractors ("SWC"), we are requesting the SWC initiate an internal review with the SWC Water Transfers Committee and/or SWC Board of Directors and follow-up with a recommendation to the Department to approve this water exchange program. The need for a recommendation from the SWC Board for this exchange is because the authority delegated to the SWC General Manager (SWC Resolution adopted 1/17/2008) addresses exchanges made in one year for return in multiple years, but does not address delegating authority to the General Manager to recommend exchanges made over multiple years, even though the return period is within a ten-year period from the initial transfer.

To assist DWR in preparing a long-term agreement approving this water exchange program, enclosed is a completed "Contract Information Form".
