RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF IRVINE RANCH WATER DISTRICT COMMENDING WAYNE POSEY FOR HIS DEDICATED AND OUTSTANDING SERVICE TO THE DISTRICT

WHEREAS, Wayne Posey began his career at the Irvine Ranch Water District on August 18, 1980 as an Operator 1 where he performed work activities related to the operation of wastewater treatment and recycling processes and equipment of the Michelson Water Recycling Plant; and

WHEREAS, Wayne was promoted to Operator III in 1981; Wastewater Operations Supervisor in 1982; Wastewater Operations Manager in 1990; and in 1999 to the position of Director of Wastewater Operations which he holds today; and

WHEREAS, Wayne has provided the District with 33 years of outstanding service to the District in wastewater collection systems and treatment processing; and

WHEREAS, for the past 14 years, as the Director of Wastewater Operations, wayne directed all phases of operations and mechanical/electrical maintenance for the Michelson Wastewater Recycling Plant, the Los Alisos Water Recycling Plant, 960 miles of sewer collection system with 16 lift stations, the entire mechanical and electrical maintenance program for potable water distribution system and recycled water distribution system and the fat and oil grease management program. Additionally, he effectively managed an operations and maintenance annual budget of \$26 million and led a department of 64 employees; and

WHEREAS, Wayne is known for his extensive technical and leadership skills and has mentored many employees throughout his years with thoughtfulness and compassion; and

WHEREAS, during Wayne's tenure at the District, he has received many certifications including the California State Water Resources Control Board's Grade V Wastewater Treatment Plant Operator; California Water Environment Association's Grade III Collection System Maintenance and Mechanical Technical Technologist Certificate, the California Water Environment Association's Grade II Industrial Waste Treatment Plant Operator Certificate, the American Water Works Association's Grade II Water Distribution Operator Certificate, and the California Department of Health Services Grade II Water Treatment Operator Certificate; and

WHEREAS, Wayne is to be recognized for his team effort with Mark Gingras, Dave Hayden and Ray Resendez as a member of the *IRWD Raging Reclaimers*, who received regional and state honors from the California Water Pollution Control Associations' *Operations Challenge* competitions. The *Raging Reclaimers* participated in many events over several years and received first place regional honors for two consecutive years as well as first place in state competitions in the Mechanical Maintenance, Collection System and Laboratory categories; and

WHEREAS, in the late 1980's several District employees were involved with preserving three historical houses which were placed within the San Joaquin Wildlife Sanctuary and Wayne, his wife Cindi and three children spent more than 1,500 hours renovating both his house and two other homes. With all of these efforts, he was able to reside in one of the oldest of the three dwellings, a 1900 vintage three bedroom house for several years, enjoying the peace and serenity of this area.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, the Board of Directors of the Irvine Ranch Water District commends Wayne Posey for his long and loyal service. PUBLIC HEARING

REPORT ON WATER QUALITY RELATIVE TO PUBLIC HEALTH GOALS

SUMMARY:

Staff is presenting the 2013 Report on Water Quality Relative to Public Health Goals, a triennial report required by the California Health and Safety Code summarizing constituents detected in the District's water supply at levels exceeding applicable Public Health Goals or Maximum Contaminant Level Goals during calendar years 2010, 2011 and 2012. Staff recommends that a public hearing regarding the report be held on July 22, 2013 at the District's Regular Board meeting to accept any public comments that may be provided regarding the report.

BACKGROUND:

The California Health and Safety Code, Section 116470, requires public water systems with more than 10,000 service connections to prepare a brief written report that provides information regarding the detection of any contaminants above the Public Health Goals adopted by the State Office of Environmental Health Hazard Assessment or the Maximum Contaminant Level Goals set by the United States Environmental Protection Agency. These reports are intended to provide information to the public in addition to the Consumer Confidence Report that is mailed annually to each customer. The California Department of Public Health does not require public water systems to take any action to reduce or eliminate any exceedance of a public health goal.

A public water system that is required to prepare a Public Health Goal Report is also required to hold a public hearing for the purpose of accepting and responding to public comments regarding the report. The public hearing may be part of any regularly scheduled meeting. Due to the detection of a number of contaminants detected in the IRWD potable water system above the Public Health Goals, the District is required to prepare a Public Health Goal Report and hold a public hearing. The report has been prepared and is attached as Exhibit "A", and a public hearing regarding the report will be held on July 22, 2013 at the District's Regular Board meeting to accept any public comments that may be provided regarding the report.

IRVINE RANCH WATER DISTRICT REPORT ON WATER QUALITY RELATIVE TO PUBLIC HEALTH GOALS PWS #3010092

BACKGROUND:

Provisions of the California Health and Safety Code (Reference No. 1) specify that larger (>10,000 service connections) water utilities prepare a special report by July 1, 2013 if their water quality measurements have exceeded any Public Health Goals (PHGs). PHGs are non-enforceable goals established by the California Environmental Protection Agency's (Cal-EPA's) Office of Environmental Health Hazard Assessment (OEHHA). The law also requires that where OEHHA has not adopted a PHG for a constituent, the water suppliers are to use the Maximum Contaminant Level Goals (MCLGs) adopted by United States Environmental Protection Agency (USEPA). Only constituents which have a California primary drinking water standard and for which either a PHG or MCLG has been set are to be addressed. (Reference No. 2 is a list of all regulated constituents with the Maximum Contaminant Levels (MCLs) and PHGs or MCLGs.

There are a few constituents that are routinely detected in water systems at levels usually well below the drinking water standards for which no PHG or MCLG has yet been adopted by OEHHA or USEPA. These will be addressed in a future required report after a PHG has been adopted.

The law specifies what information is to be provided in the report, (See Reference No. 1)

If a constituent was detected in the District's water supply in 2010, 2011 or 2012 at a level exceeding an applicable PHG or MCLG, this report provides the information required by the law. Included is the numerical public health risk associated with the MCL and the PHG or MCLG, the category or type of risk to health that could be associated with each constituent, the best treatment technology available that could be used to reduce the constituent level, and an estimate of the cost to install that treatment if it is appropriate and feasible.

What Are PHGs?

PHGs are set by the California Office of Environmental Health Hazard Assessment (OEHHA) which is part of Cal-EPA and are based solely on public health risk considerations. None of the practical risk-management factors that are considered by the USEPA or the California Department of Public Health (CDPH) in setting drinking water standards (MCLs) are considered in setting the PHGs. These factors include analytical detection capability, treatment technology available, benefits and costs. The PHGs are not enforceable and are not required to be met by any public water system. MCLGs are the federal equivalent to PHGs.

Water Quality Data Considered:

All of the water quality data collected by the District's system from 2010 to 2012 for purposes of determining compliance with drinking water standards was considered. This data was summarized in our Annual Consumer Confidence Reports which were distributed to all of our customers in 2011, 2012 and 2013.

Guidelines Followed:

The Association of California Water Agencies (ACWA) formed a workgroup which prepared guidelines for water utilities to use in preparing these newly required reports. The ACWA guidelines were used in the preparation of this report. No guidance was available from state regulatory agencies.

Best Available Treatment Technology and Cost Estimates:

Both the USEPA and CDHS adopt what are known as Best Available Technologies (BATs) which are the best known methods of reducing contaminant levels to the MCL. Costs can be estimated for such technologies. However, since many PHGs and all MCLGs are set much lower than the MCL, it is not always possible or feasible to determine what treatment is needed to further reduce a constituent downward to or near the PHG or MCLG, many of which are set at zero. Estimating the costs to reduce a constituent to zero is difficult, if not impossible because it is not possible to verify by analytical means that the level has been lowered to zero. In some cases, installing treatment to try and further reduce very low levels of one constituent may have adverse effects on other aspects of water quality.

CONSTITUENTS DETECTED THAT EXCEED A PHG OR A MCLG:

The following is a discussion of constituents that were detected in one or more of the District's drinking water sources at levels above the PHG, or if no PHG, above the MCLG.

Arsenic:

The PHG for arsenic is 0.004 parts per billion (ppb). The MCL, or drinking water standard, for arsenic is 10 ppb. We have detected arsenic in 12 of our 27 wells at the following levels: 2.9 ppb in Dyer Road Well Field (DRWF) Well 1, 5.1 ppb in DRWF Well 2, 2.8 ppb in DRWF Well 4, 5.7 ppb in DRWF Well 5, 4.6 ppb in DRWF Well 6, 2.1 ppb in DRWF Well 15, 5.1 ppb in DRWF Well 18, 3.8 ppb in Irvine Desalter Project (IDP) Well 76, 3.9 ppb in IDP Well 77, 4.6 ppb in IDP Well 107, 8.2 ppb in IDP Well 110 and 4.9 ppb in IDP Well 115. Arsenic was detected in product water from the IDP Potable Treatment Plant (IDP/PTP) at a level of 6.0 ppb. Arsenic was detected in imported water purchased from the Metropolitan Water District of Southern California (MWD), the highest level was 2.3 ppb and was not detected in the most recent sample. These levels were below the MCL. The category of health risk associated with arsenic, and the reason that a drinking water standard was adopted for it, is that some people who drink water containing arsenic above the MCL over many years may experience skin damage or circulatory system problems, and may have an increased risk of cancer. The numerical health risk for a PHG of 0.004 ppb is 1×10^{-6} (1 in 1,000,000). The BATs for arsenic to lower the level below the MCL are Reverse Osmosis (RO), Ion Exchange (IE), activated alumina, lime softening, electrodialysis reversal, oxidation/filtration or coagulation/filtration. RO or IE would be required to attempt to lower the arsenic levels to below the PHG. The IDP Potable Treatment Plant (PTP) is an RO facility which reduces arsenic levels in water from the IDP wells, though the plant would probably need to be operated with 0% bypass to meet the PHG. The estimated cost to install and operate such a treatment system on DRWF Wells 1, 2, 4, 5, 6, 15 and 18 that would reliably reduce the arsenic levels to below the PHG would be approximately \$14,535,000 per year including annualized capital and O&M costs. The estimated cost to install and operate such a treatment system at each MWD turnout that would reliably reduce the arsenic level to below the PHG would be approximately \$209,781,000 per year including annualized capital and

O&M costs. This would result in an assumed increased cost for each customer of \$2,476 per year.

Gross Alpha Activity:

OEHHA has not established a PHG for gross alpha activity. The MCLG for gross alpha activity is 0 pCi/l. The MCL, or drinking water standard, for gross alpha activity is 15 pCi/l. We have detected gross alpha activity in 7 of our 27 wells at the following levels: 3.0 pCi/l in DRWF Well 13, 3.1 pCi/l in DRWF Well 16, 8.6 pCi/l in IDP Well 76, 10 pCi/l in IDP Well 77, 8.3 pCi/l in IDP Well 107, 9.4 pCi/l in IDP Well 110 and 7.3 pCi/l in IDP Well 115. The IDP/PTP is an RO facility which reduces gross alpha activity levels in water from the IDP wells. Gross alpha activity was detected in the IDP/PTP product water at a level of 4.6 pCi/l. Gross alpha activity was detected in imported water purchased from MWD, the highest level was 5.6 pCi/l and the most recent sample was 3.0 pCi/l. All of these levels were below the MCL. The category of health risk associated with gross alpha activity, and the reason that a drinking water standard was adopted for it, is that people who drink water containing gross alpha activity above the MCL throughout their lifetime could experience an increased risk of cancer. The numerical health risk for a MCLG of 0 pCi/l is 0. The BATs for gross alpha activity to lower the level below the MCL are RO, IE, lime softening or coagulation/filtration. RO or IE would be required to attempt to lower the gross alpha activity level to the MCLG. The IDP PTP is an RO facility which reduces gross alpha activity levels in water from the IDP wells, though the plant would probably need to be operated with 0% bypass to meet the PHG. The estimated cost to install and operate such a treatment system on DRWF Wells 13 and 16 that would reliably reduce the gross alpha activity levels to below the PHG would be approximately \$4,153,000 per year including annualized capital and O&M costs. The estimated cost to install and operate such a treatment system at each MWD turnout that would reliably reduce the gross alpha activity level to the MCLG would be approximately \$209,781,000 per year including annualized capital and O&M costs. This would result in an assumed increased cost for each customer of \$2,361 per year.

Gross Beta Activity:

OEHHA has not established a PHG for gross beta activity. The MCLG for gross beta activity is 0 pCi/l. The MCL or drinking water standard for gross beta activity is 50 pCi/l. Gross beta activity was detected in imported water purchased from MWD, the highest level detected was 4.3 pCi/l and was not detected in the most recent sample. All of these levels were below the MCL. The category of health risk associated with gross beta activity, and the reason that a drinking water standard was adopted for it, is that people who drink water containing gross beta activity above the MCL throughout their lifetime could experience an increased risk of cancer. The numerical health risk for a MCLG of 0 pCi/l is 0. The BATs for gross beta activity to lower the level below the MCL are RO, IE, lime softening or coagulation/filtration. RO or IE would be required to attempt to lower the gross beta activity level to the MCLG. The estimated cost to install and operate such a treatment system at each MWD turnout that would reliably reduce the gross beta activity level to the MCLG would be approximately \$209,781,000 per year including annualized capital and O&M costs. This would result in an assumed increased cost for each customer of \$2,316 per year.

Uranium:

The PHG for uranium is 0.43 pCi/l. The MCL, or drinking water standard, for uranium is 20 pCi/l. We have detected uranium in 12 of our 27 wells at the following levels: 1.3 pCi/ in

DRWF Well 7, 1.2 pCi/ in DRWF Well 10, 1.8 pCi/ in DRWF Well 12, 1.6 pCi/ in DRWF Well 13, 1.9 pCi/ in DRWF Well 16, 2.1 pCi/ in DRWF Well 17, 1.1 pCi/l in DRWF Well 18, 9.3pCi/l in IDP Well 76, 9.5 pCi/l in IDP Well 77, 8.1 pCi/l in IDP Well 107, 8.6 pCi/l in IDP Well 110 and 5.8 pCi/l in IDP Well 115. The IDP/PTP is an RO facility which reduces uranium levels in water from the IDP wells. Uranium was detected in the IDP/PTP product water at a level of 2.9 pCi/l. Uranium was detected in imported water purchased from MWD, the highest level detected was 3.3 pCi/l and the most recent sample was 2.0 pCi/l. These levels were below the MCL. The category of health risk associated with uranium, and the reason that a drinking water standard was adopted for it, is that people who drink water containing uranium above the MCL throughout their lifetime could experience kidney problems or an increased risk of cancer. The numerical health risk for a PHG of 0.43 pCi/l is 1x10⁻⁶ (1 in 1,000,000). The BATs for uranium to lower the level below the MCL are RO, IE, lime softening or coagulation/filtration. RO or IE would be required to attempt to lower the uranium level to below the PHG. The IDP PTP is an RO facility which reduces uranium levels in water from the IDP wells, though the plant would probably need to be operated with 0% bypass to meet the PHG. The estimated cost to install and operate such a treatment system on DRWF Wells 7, 10, 12, 13, 16, 17 and 18 that would reliably reduce the uranium level to below the PHG would be approximately \$11,647,000 per year including annualized capital and O&M costs. The estimated cost to install and operate such a treatment system at each MWD turnout that would reliably reduce the gross beta activity level to the MCLG would be approximately \$209,781,000 per year including annualized capital and O&M costs. This would result in an assumed increased cost for each customer of \$2,443 per year.

Radium 228:

The PHG for radium 228 is 0.019 pCi/l. The MCL, or drinking water standard, for combined radium 226 and radium 228 is 5 pCi/l. We have detected radium 228 in 1 of our 27 wells at a level 1.0 pCi/l in IDP Well #110. The level detected were below the MCL. The category of health risk associated with radium 228, and the reason that a drinking water standard was adopted for it, is that people who drink water containing radium 228 above the MCL throughout their lifetime could experience an increased risk of cancer. The numerical health risk for a PHG of 0.019 pCi/l is 1x10⁻⁶ (1 in 1,000,000). The BATs for radium 228 to lower the level below the MCL are RO, IE, lime softening or coagulation/filtration. RO or IE would be required to attempt to lower the radium 228 levels to below the PHG. The IDP/PTP is an RO facility which reduces Radium 228 levels in water from the IDP wells. The IDP/PTP product water was analyzed for Radium 228 and it was not detected, therefore no cost estimate was prepared.

Combined Treatment Cost

Since the same technology is utilized to treat all of the constituents included in this report each of the locations above should only require a single treatment facility each to reduce levels of all of these constituents to below the PHG or MCLG. The estimated cost to install and operate such s treatment system on DRWF Wells 1, 2, 4, 5, 6, 7, 10, 12, 13, 16, 17 and 18 that would reliably reduce the levels of the above constituents to levels below the PHG or MCLG would be approximately \$19,966,000 per year including annualized capital and O&M costs. The estimated cost to install and operate such a treatment system at each MWD turnout that would reliably reduce the gross beta activity level to the MCLG would be approximately \$209,781,000 per year including annualized capital and O&M costs. This would result in an assumed increased cost for each customer of \$2,535 per year to lower the levels of Arsenic, gross alpha activity, gross beta activity and uranium to levels below the PHG or MCLG.

RECOMMENDATIONS FOR FURTHER ACTION:

The drinking water quality of the Irvine Ranch Water District meets all State of California, Department of Public Health and USEPA drinking water standards set to protect public health. To further reduce the levels of the constituents identified in this report that are already significantly below the health-based Maximum Contaminant Levels established to provide "safe drinking water", additional costly treatment processes would be required. The effectiveness of the treatment processes to provide any significant reductions in constituent levels at these already low values is uncertain. The health protection benefits of these further hypothetical reductions are not at all clear and may not be quantifiable. Therefore, no action is proposed.

CALIFORNIA PUBLIC HEALTH GOAL REQUIREMENTS REFERENCE NO. 1

California Health and Safety Code Section 116470

- (b) On or before July 1, 1998, and every three years thereafter, public water systems serving more than 10,000 service connections that detect one or more contaminants in drinking water that exceed the applicable public health goal, shall prepare a brief written report in plain language that does all of the following:
 - (1) Identifies each contaminant detected in drinking water that exceeds the applicable public health goal.
 - (2) Discloses the numerical public health risk, determined by the office, associated with the maximum contaminant level for each contaminant identified in paragraph (1) and the numerical public health risk determined by the office associated with the public health goal for that contaminant.
 - (3) Identifies the category of risk to public health, including, but not limited to, carcinogenic, mutagenic, teratogenic, and acute toxicity, associated with exposure to the contaminant in drinking water, and includes a brief plainly worded description of these terms.
 - (4) Describes the best available technology, if any is then available on a commercial basis, to remove the contaminant or reduce the concentration of the contaminant. The public water system may, solely at its own discretion, briefly describe actions that have been taken on its own, or by other entities, to prevent the introduction of the contaminant into drinking water supplies.
 - (5) Estimates the aggregate cost and the cost per customer of utilizing the technology described in paragraph (4), if any, to reduce the concentration of that contaminant in drinking water to a level at or below the public health goal.
 - (6)Briefly describes what action, if any, the local water purveyor intends to take to reduce the concentration of the contaminant in public drinking water supplies and the basis for that decision.
- (c) Public water systems required to prepare a report pursuant to subdivision (b) shall hold a public hearing for the purpose of accepting and responding to public comment on the report. Public water systems may hold the public hearing as part of any regularly scheduled meeting.
- (d) The department shall not require a public water system to take any action to reduce or eliminate any exceedance of a public health goal.
- (e) Enforcement of this section does not require the department to amend a public water system's operating permit.
- (f) Pending adoption of a public health goal by the Office of Environmental Health Hazard Assessment pursuant to subdivision (c) of Section 116365, and in lieu thereof, public water systems shall use the national maximum contaminant level goal adopted by the United States Environmental Protection Agency for the corresponding contaminant for purposes of complying with the notice and hearing requirements of this section.
- (g) This section is intended to provide an alternative form for the federally required consumer confidence report as authorized by 42 U.S.C. Section 300g-3(c).

MINUTES OF ADJOURNED REGULAR MEETING - JUNE 28, 2013

The adjourned regular meeting of the Board of Directors of the Irvine Ranch Water District (IRWD) was called to order at 11:00 a.m. by President Reinhart on June 28, 2013 in the District's Multi-purpose Room, 15600 Sand Canyon Avenue, Irvine, California.

REVIEW AGENDA AND DESIRED OUTCOMES

General Manager Cook reviewed the agenda and desired outcomes.

DRAFT WATER EFFICIENCY PLAN

Using a PowerPoint presentation, Ms. Fiona Sanchez provided an update on staff's efforts to update the Water Efficiency Plan to reflect changes in legislation and shifts in long-term water use patterns. Ms. Sanchez said that in 2005, a Conservation Business Plan was adopted which provided more focus and targeted approach to the conservation program and consisted of the following elements: policy leadership; rate structure improvements; focused customer interface; education and outreach initiatives; research and technology advancement; and tactical conservation initiatives.

Ms. Sanchez described the Water Conservation Act of 2009, referred to as 20 x 2020, which marked a major change in conservation where for the first time the state mandated a reduction in daily per capita water use (gpcd). She said that the state is required to achieve a statewide 20% reduction in per capita use by 2020. IRWD's 20 x 2020 target is 171 gpcd. Actual use for 2012 was 135.3 gpcd. This reflects a combination of IRWD's conservation efforts, combined with impacts from the recent economic downturn and drought. Ongoing conservation efforts will maintain IRWD's gpcd at a level that meets or is below the 20 x 2020 target.

Ms. Sanchez said that although IRWD implements a portfolio of programs designed to target and reach each customer segment, staff conducted an analysis of IRWD water use in order to assess where the most potential for additional conservation exists. She said that as the charts indicate, residential represents 87% of total customer accounts and 45% of use. Commercial and industrial only represents 6% of accounts, but 21% of total use. A significant amount, 26%, of non-residential landscape is irrigated with recycled water. Potable non-residential landscape only represents 2% of customer accounts and 8% of total use.

Ms. Sanchez said that staff is proposing to continue to implement all of the elements of the Plan. Staff proposes continuing cost-effective indoor programs, but switching the majority of the water efficiency program focus to residential outdoor water use. Programs will also continue to be designed and offered for landscape irrigation and commercial and industrial customers. In all cases, programs will be designed to leverage regional rebate and grant funding. She said that staff is proposing to use the term "CalScape" to brand the new outdoor water use program, which is a combination of either California or Climate Appropriate Landscape and Landscape which incorporates choosing the right plants - climate appropriate; watering the right amount at the right time; and selecting and maintaining the right irrigation equipment.

Ms. Sanchez said that staff will work closely with Public Affairs to create new outreach campaigns and messaging to support the new initiative, integrating feedback from the recent customer outreach surveys and focus groups. In response to Director Reinhart's inquiry, Ms. Sanchez said that staff often attends homeowner association meetings for outreach opportunities. Director Reinhart asked staff to reach out to cities relative to our rate s to educate them on the District's tier rate structure. In response to Director Swan's suggestion, Ms. Sanchez said that she could include household per capita use and reflect this in the update. Discussion was held on residents using drought tolerant plant for saving and to focus communications with homeowner associations.

LONG-TERM CAPITAL FINANCING PLAN PROCESS PROGRESS UPDATE

Executive Director of Finance Clary reported that staff has undertaken a process to review and, if appropriate, to develop modifications to the District's current capital funding plan as directed by the Board. Ms. Clary said that the focus of this review has been to identify issues with the existing capital funding plan and to consider adjustments that would make the plan more practical as the District nears build-out and transitions its focus to ongoing operations and maintenance activities. The review process has included the input and direction from the Finance and Personnel Committee (Committee) as well as input from interested outside participants (referred to as the Working Group) which includes representatives from the development community and allows them to provide input as staff develops its updated Long-Term Capital Funding Plan (LTFP).

Using a PowerPoint presentation, Mr. Christopher Smithson reviewed the key elements of the current capital funding model; issues confronting the current capital funding model; guiding principles; the long-term capital review process; summary of tasks completed to date; working assumptions used to modify baseline scenarios; current and proposed capital project definitions; and including "110/210" in future regional allocations. Director Swan relayed his concerns that

the Irvine Company (TIC) and other future developments should not be consolidated into a single improvement district, and that based on the completed assets 110 has historically funded and its exclusion from the Improvement Districts (ID) formed in 1978, he did not concur with staff's recommendations relative to including 110 in future capital funding with an estimated impact of \$.41 per month for residential customers. Director LaMar said he disagreed with Director Swan on the 110 matter, and said that the cost would be reasonable and equitable. President Reinhart said that he believed it is appropriate for the Board to consider this in light of circumstances today that may not have been contemplated in 1978, and asked what staff recommended. Executive Director of Finance Clary said that this allocation for 110 is a fair and equitable approach. Mr. Peter Herzog of National Association of Industrial and Office Properties, was in the audience and commented that Director Swan's suggestion as to separation of TIC and other developing area in the consolidation scenario has not been discussed with the working group and would appreciate discussion at a future meeting. Director Swan asked for a separate vote on the 110/220 inclusion and on the developing ID separation. His suggestion did not receive a consensus. Discussion followed regarding the concept of separate developing IDs and communication with the developers to obtain their concurrence, and General Manager Cook said that staff could pursue this issue with TIC in the interim if this is the Board's pleasure. It was the consensus that further analysis should be made of the concept before pursuing this. Following discussion, on MOTION and carried (Reinhart, Withers, Matheis, LaMar voting aye and Swan voting no), THE BOARD APPROVED THE APPLICATION OF THE ADJUSTED CAPITAL DEFINITIONS AND INCLUDING 110/210 IN THE REGIONAL ALLOCATIONS FOR FUTURE CAPITAL FUNDING.

IRWD GOALS AND PRIORITIES

General Manager Cook said that staff has updated the IRWD Target Activities Priorities List for the Board's review, comment, and approval. President Reinhart asked that this item be deferred to the July 8, 2013 Board meeting for discussion. There being no objection, this item was removed from the agenda.

BOARD PROCESS REVIEW

The District's consultant, Mr. Loren Lillestrand, provided the Board with overview of his leadership coaching program.

MINUTES OF REGULAR MEETING - JULY 8, 2013

The regular meeting of the Board of Directors of the Irvine Ranch Water District (IRWD) was called to order at 5:00 p.m. by President Reinhart on July 8, 2013 in the District office, 15600 Sand Canyon Avenue, Irvine, California.

Also Present: General Manager Cook, Executive Director of Finance Clary, Executive Director of Engineering Burton, Executive Director of Operations Sheilds, Director of Public Affairs Beeman, Executive Director of Water Policy Heiertz, Director of Risk Management and Treasury Jacobson, Director of Water Resources Weghorst, Assistant Director of Conservation Sanchez, Legal Counsel Arneson, Secretary Bonkowski, Ms. Gretchen Maswadeh, Ms. Christine Compton, Ms. Shannon Reed, Mr. Jim Reed, Mr. Bruce Newell, Ms. Erika Blaska, Mr. Richard Bernard, Director Matheis* (listened via telephone conference call but did not participate) and Mr. David Silvela and other members of the public and staff.

WRITTEN COMMUNICATION: None.

ORAL COMMUNICATION

1) Mrs. Joan Irvine Smith's assistant addressed the Board of Directors with respect to the Dyer Road wellfield. She said it was her understanding that currently wells 4, C-8, C-9, 10, 12, 13, 14, 15, 17 and 18 will operate in accordance with the District's annual pumping plan. Wells 1, 2, 3, 5, 6, 7, 11 and 16 will be off. This was confirmed by Mr. Cook, General Manager of the District.

With respect to the OCWD annexation of certain IRWD lands, on June 5, 2009, IRWD received a letter from OCWD noting that OCWD has completed the formal responses to comments they previously received on the draft program Environmental Impact Report. The letter further noted that with this task completed, OCWD has exercised its right to terminate the 2004 Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) regarding annexation. OCWD also indicated that due to the lack of progress on the annexation issue, the draft program Environmental Impact Report will not be completed. On June 8, 2009, OCWD completed the Long-Term Facilities Plan which was received and filed by the OCWD Board in July 2009. Staff has been coordinating with the City of Anaheim (Anaheim) and Yorba Linda Water District (YLWD) on their most recent annexation requests and has reinitiated the annexation process with OCWD. IRWD, YLWD and Anaheim have negotiated a joint MOU with OCWD to process and conduct environmental analysis of the annexation requests. The MOU was approved by the OCWD Board on July 21, 2010. This was confirmed by Mr. Cook.

With respect to the Groundwater Emergency Service Plan, IRWD has an agreement in place with various south Orange County water agencies, MWDOC and OCWD, to produce additional groundwater for use within IRWD and transfer imported water from IRWD to south Orange County in case of emergencies. IRWD has approved the operating agreement with certain south Orange County water agencies to fund the interconnection facilities needed to affect the emergency transfer of water. MWDOC and OCWD have also both approved the operating agreement. This was confirmed by Mr. Cook.

ACTION CALENDAR

WATER SMART PROGRAM

Staff is proposing to expand upon the FY 2012-13 Water Smart Report Pilot Program to capitalize on the effectiveness of providing enhanced water use information to District customers separately from their water bills. The proposed Water Smart Report Program will roll out to approximately 15,000 single family customers. Hard copy or electronic reports will be sent to project participants for a 12-month period. The Water Smart Pilot Program has just concluded

and initial results indicate that the experimental homes (approximately 1,000 homes) used 2.3% less water than the control group of homes over the course of a year.

On <u>MOTION</u> by Swan, seconded and carried, (Reinhart, Matheis, LaMar and Swan voting aye and Withers and Matheis absent), SUBJECT TO NON-SUBSTANTIVE CHANGES, THE BOARD AUTHORIZED THE GENERAL MANAGER TO EXECUTE AN AGREEMENT WITH WATERSMART SOFTWARE, INC TO IMPLEMENT AN EXPANDED WATER REPORT PROGRAM FOR A TOTAL COST OF \$90,000 FOR FY 2013-14.

INDEMNIFICATION AGREEMENT FOR STATE WATER PROJECT WATER POOL DEMONSTRATION PROGRAM

Director of Water Resources Weghorst reported that in response to continuing dry weather conditions statewide, the Dudley Ridge Water District (DRWD) has established a 2013-2014 Multi-Year Water Pool Demonstration Program to allow water-short SWP contractors to purchase SWP water at a reasonable cost from other willing SWP contractors for a period of two consecutive years. Mr. Weghorst said that this Water Pool Program is in addition to the single year Turnback Pool program which has not functioned as expected in recent years due primarily to low pricing. The Water Pool Program is being established to address pricing issues in the hopes of generating enough water to satisfy basic water needs for all SWP contractors. DRWD expects that its share of the water available in the Water Pool Program will be approximately 4,000 AF per year, assuming that a high percentage of other SWP contractors and DRWD participate in the program. If fewer SWP contractors participate in the program, DRWD's share could be as high as 20,000 AF per year. Director Withers arrived at 5:13 p.m.

Mr. Weghorst said that according to the information provided by DRWD, the purchase price of the water from the program decreases as the SWP allocation percentage increases. The pricing structure makes it reasonable for IRWD to participate in the Water Pool Program when the SWP water allocation is above 60% with a maximum price of \$115 per AF and a minimum price of \$25 per AF at an allocation of 100%.

Mr. Weghorst said that any water secured by IRWD through its participation in the Water Pool Program would be stored in the Strand Ranch Integrated Banking Project under the IRWD / DRWD Unbalanced Exchange Program (Exchange Program). He said that based on the DWR pricing structure for the Water Pool Program, staff recommends IRWD request water from the Water Pool Program for year 2014 when the SWP allocation is above 60% in amounts that would round out IRWD's supply to its full Table A allotment of 1,748 AF plus an additional 50% of a full allocation.

Mr. Weghorst said that DRWD has determined that the Water Pool Program is consistent with DRWD policy and has agreed to facilitate the project for interested DRWD's water users. DRWD wants to ensure that its costs incurred for the benefit of those interested participants do not impact other DRWD landowners, and therefore DRWD is requiring that those water users wishing to participate in the Program execute an indemnification agreement.

Director Swan said that the demonstration project is the first step in assisting landowners and the Water Banking Committee concurs with the staff recommendation with the caveat that any

subsequent indemnification be submitted to Committee for review. On MOTION by Swan, seconded and carried (Matheis absent), SUBJECT TO ANY SUBSEQUENT INDEMNIFICATIONS TO BE SUBMITTED TO THE WATER BANKING COMMITTEE, THE BOARD AUTHORIZED THE GENERAL MANAGER TO EXECUTE THE INDEMNIFICATION AGREEMENT WITH DUDLEY RIDGE WATER DISTRICT (DRWD) TO PARTICIPATE IN THE 2014 MULTI-YEAR WATER POOL PROGRAM AND AUTHORIZED THE GENERAL MANAGER TO EXECUTE ANY DRWD INDEMNIFICATION AGREEMENTS WITH SUBSTANTIALLY THE SAME TERMS THAT DRWD MIGHT REQUIRE PARTICIPATION IN OTHER FUTURE SUPPLEMENTAL WATER PROGRAMS.

PRESENTATION

2013 CUSTOMER SATISFACTION SURVEY RESULTS

Ms. Erika Blaska reported that in January 2013, the Board authorized staff to proceed with a Customer Satisfaction Survey designed to assist staff in the development of new programs and services that best meet customers' needs. The results gauge customers' general view of the District, their perception of the quality of the water provided by IRWD, and examine customers' attitudes about the ways in which IRWD communicates with them in areas that include customer service, water use efficiency and outreach programs.

Using a PowerPoint presentation, Mr. Richard Bernard of Fairbank, Maslin, Maullin, Metz & Associates, provided the survey results of customer ratings and perceptions of IRWD on various issues including overall perception of IRWD, water quality, conservation actions and knowledge, communications with IRWD, IRWD tours and workshops. Mr. Bernard summarized the key findings unique to the focus group which included: 1) non e-Bill payers are generally satisfied with the billing experience, and did not see an incentive to change; 2) EBill payers are very satisfied with billing experience and convenience; 3) customers lacked knowledge about how water bills are calculated; 4) reactions to website were positive, including content and topics; 5) EBill customers are aware of the newsletter, but most do not read it; 6) customers did not understand many IRWD words and phrases; and 7) participants expressed strongly favorable views toward rebates, but were unfamiliar with them. Following discussion, staff was asked to publish the survey results in the Pipelines newsletter over several months; to include a section on the website for individuals to voice opinions; change language of the bills from ccfs to gallons used to have a clearer understanding of water usage; community activities to be placed on the website for other areas of interest, and a suggestion of have periodic contests to increase website enthusiasm.

ACTION CALENDAR

WATER SHORTAGE ASSISTANCE TO BUENA VISTA WATER STORAGE DISTRICT

Director of Water Resources Weghorst reported that in December 2010, IRWD and Buena Vista Water Storage District (BVWSD) executed an Agreement for Water Acquisition by Irvine Ranch Water District from Buena Vista Water Management Program (Water Acquisition Agreement)

that allows BVWSD to deliver up to 17,500 AF of high-flow Kern River Water into storage at the Strand Ranch in any year on an unbalanced exchange basis. This agreement allows BVWSD to recover up to 6,667 AF of its water in any year with IRWD paying the cost of the recovery of this water on BVWSD's behalf.

Mr. Weghorst said that as requested by the Water Banking Committee on April 23, 2013, staff has been working with Rosedale, BVWSD and Antelope Valley-East Kern Water Agency (AVEK) identifying if opportunities exist for IRWD to provide water shortage assistance in 2013. AVEK is currently evaluating their needs for water and is considering calling for water under the terms of the Pilot Exchange Program between IRWD and AVEK that was executed in 2012. BVWSD has identified that it is in need of additional water above the 6,667 AF of water that IRWD is currently returning to BVWSD from the Strand Ranch. After the recovery and delivery of the 6,667 AF of water to BVWSD, they will hold 2,326 AF of water in storage at the Strand Ranch. BVWSD maintains a balance of 1,475 AF in the Stockdale West Pilot Project.

Mr. Weghorst that IRWD legal counsel has prepared a letter agreement that will allow BVWSD to recover additional water during 2013 up to its balance in storage at the Strand Ranch. The letter agreement calls for BVWSD to pay the full cost of the recovery and delivery of the additional water to its service area. Recovery of this additional water by BVWSD will not exceed the 17,500 AF per year recovery limit for the Strand Ranch.

Director Swan said that this item was reviewed and approved by the Water Banking Committee on June 20, 2013. Following discussion, staff was asked to speak with BVWSD to determine the best method to communication tonight's action to provide water shortage assistance. On MOTION by Swan, seconded and carried (Matheis absent), THE BOARD AUTHORIZED THE GENERAL MANAGER TO EXECUTE THE LETTER AGREEMENT WITH BUENA VISTA WATER STORAGE DISTRICT (BVWSD) SUBJECT TO NON-SUBSTANTIVE CHANGES THAT ALLOWS BVWSD TO RECOVER ADDITIONAL WATER FROM THE STRAND RANCH INTEGRATED BANKING PROJECT IN 2013 AND PROVIDES FOR IT TO PAY ALL THE COSTS ASSOCIATED WITH THE RECOVERY AND RETURN OF THIS WATER TO THE BVWSD SERVICE AREA.

<u>LUMP SUM PAYMENT OPTION FOR EMPLOYER CONTRIBUTIONS FOR FY 2013-14</u> <u>TO THE CALIFORNIA PUBLIC EMPLOYEES RETIREMENT SYSTEM</u>

On <u>MOTION</u> by Withers, seconded and carried (Matheis absent), THE BOARD APPROVED THE LUMP SUM PAYMENT FOR EMPLOYER CONTRIBUTIONS TO THE CALIFORNIA PUBLIC EMPLOYEES RETIREMENT SYSTEM (CALPERS) BY MAKING A ONE-TIME CONTRIBUTION OF \$4,315,414 FOR THE DISTRICT'S FY 2013-14 EMPLOYER CONTRIBUTION.

WORKSHOP - IRWD GOALS AND PRIORITIES

General Manager Cook reported that the goals and priorities item was deferred from the June 28, 2013 Strategic Planning Workshop. Mr. Cook said that staff has updated the IRWD Target Activities Priorities List for the Board's review, comment, and approval which incorporates two

new items, the Long-Term Finance Plan and the Natural Treatment System Bio-retention Cell Evaluation and Monitoring and Reporting plan. The Board provided input and several adjustments were made to the target activity priority list. Staff was asked to revisit the policy relative to expense reimbursements, travel, etc. and submit to the Finance and Personnel Committee; investigate Irvine Lake storage rights before the Baker Plant becomes operational; follow-up with the Irvine Unified School District for reimbursement of the Cienega project easement; and address the millennia workforce generation in relation to the District's Succession Plan implementation. Director Swan said that with his involvement with ACWA, there has been discussions on water quality issues within disadvantaged communities in central California. He said that in the Jackson Ranch area where the District has water banking activities, perhaps in the future the District could assist with a demonstration project. General Manager Cook that that it would be imperative to obtain state and federal funding before the District could consider assistance. Following discussion, the President Reinhart asked Director Swan to define this project at the next Board meeting. Director LaMar commented on the current status of this issue noting that multiple legislative hearings are occurring in Sacramento. In response to Director Swan's request to have staff look at a future groundwater program for wheeling water from Garden Grove to Santa Ana to expand the current system, President Reinhart said that he would like the Director of Water Resources Heiertz hold a workshop on groundwater optimization discussing basin production percentage and how it fits into the District's program.

GENERAL MANAGER'S REPORT

General Manager Cook reported that tomorrow that he along with Directors Reinhart and Swan and staff will be providing the City of Lake Forest's Mayor Whitaker with a tour of Operations Center. Mr. Cook said that he was invited for a speaking engagement with Lacy Kelly of ACC-OC tomorrow for the Cox Civic Connection.

DIRECTORS' COMMENTS

Director Swan reported his attendance at a Southern California Water Dialogue group meeting and an upcoming WACO meeting this Friday.

Director LaMar also reported on attendance at a Southern California Dialogue group meeting and the on Thursday, he and General Manager Cook will be attending Colonel Toy's changing of command.

Director Withers said that he had an opportunity to change his water service and complimented the Customer Service staff on a very positive experience.

ITEM TOO LATE TO BE AGENDIZED

Director Swan recommended that a resolution be adopted to honor Colonel Toy's three years of service as Commander and District Engineer of the Los Angeles District of the United States Army Corps of Engineers. , On <u>MOTION</u> by Swan, seconded and carried (Matheis absent), IT WAS DETERMINED THAT THERE WAS A NEED TO TAKE IMMEDIATE ACTION TO ADOPT A RESOLUTION TO HONOR COLONEL TOY WHO HAS SPENT TIME OVER

Payroll ACH payments totaled \$1,417,224 and wire transfers, all other ACH payments, and checks issued for debt service, accounts payable, payroll, water purchases, and a deposit (\$35,000,000) to the IRWD Post-Employment Benefits Trust for June totaled \$51,300,220.

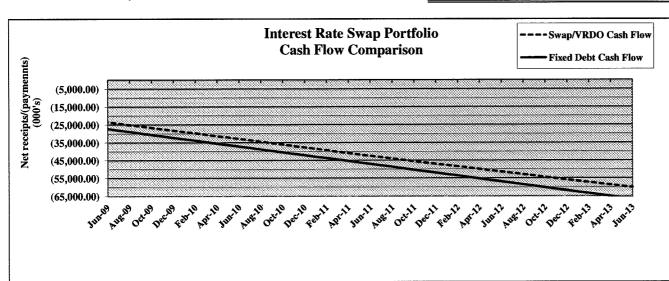

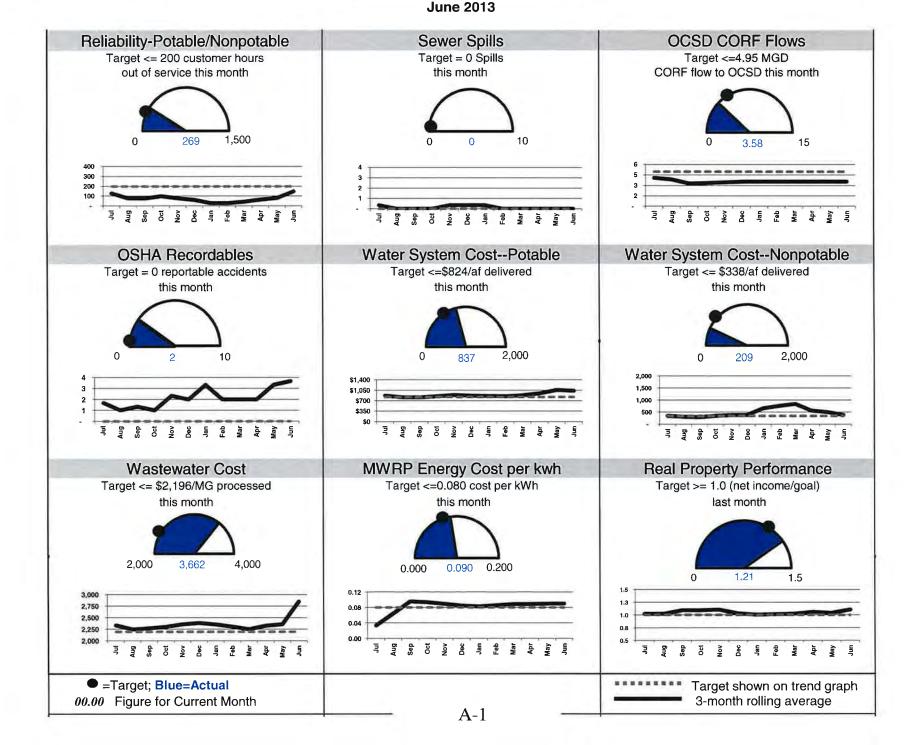

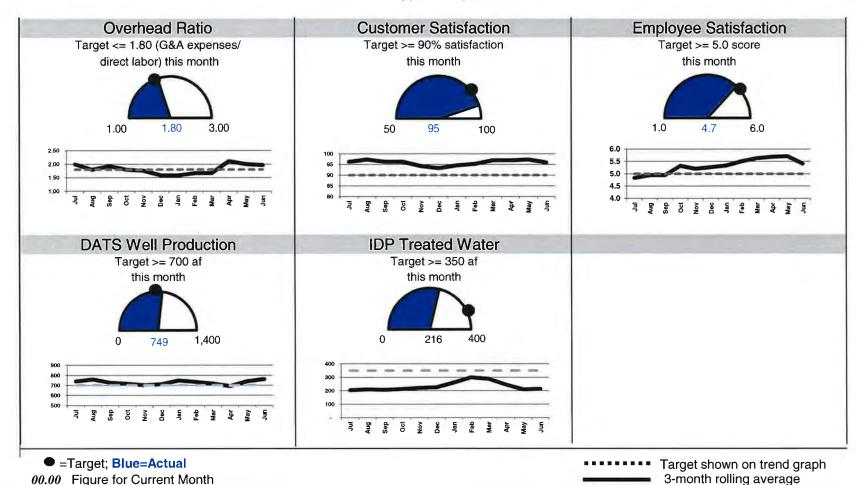

IRWD's CORF flow is derived by using the actual Main Street Flume Meter flow and subtracting the MWRP biosolid discharge flow and all non Revenue Area 14 (IRWD) flows tributary to the Main Street Flume meter/MWRP and adding in the San Joaquin Hills Planned Community flow and flow discharges from the Gas Recovery System (Formerly Laidlaw) for the FY four calendar months with the highest flow totals multiplied by three, averaging the result thereof with the same result of the same calculation for the preceding two fiscal years and adding in the current IBC transfer flow.

Note: All of the Newport Coast flows with the exception of the San Joaquin Hills Planned Community and Gas Recovery System flow are excluded from IRWD's CORF flow calculation. The OCSD's 1988 Downcoast Area Agreement only requires for IRWD to provide local wastewater collection service and requires OCSD to provide wastewater regional collection, transmission, treatment and disposal for that area.

Data Collection

The OCSD's Monthly Gallonage Flow Summary Report provides the actual flows used in calculating IRWD's CORF flow. This includes the Main Street Flume Meter actual monthly flow. All non Revenue Area 14 (IRWD) flows that are tributary to the Main Street Flume Meter is adjusted every year based on the results of OCSD's Flow Verification Study. The San Joaquin Hills Planned Community flow is adjusted every year based on the results of IRWD's Flow Verification Study. The Gas Recovery System flow is the actual monthly meter flow. The IBC transfer flow is adjusted every five years based on the results of OCSD's Flow Verification Study.

June's budget anticipated more pumped and less imported water but Water Operations staff use May and June to maximize the blend between groundwater and imported water. (1,313.8 acre feet of additional imported water was purchased and pumped water fell below budget by 924 acre feet.)

The surveys allow the customer to rate IRWD's response to their request in eight categories. Each category is rated from 1 to 5, with 1 indicating the highest level of satisfaction. A total score of 100 indicates the highest level of satisfaction in all eight categories. The scores of all responses in the subject month are a weighted average for the monthly index figure.

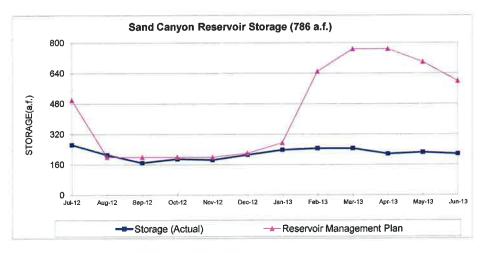

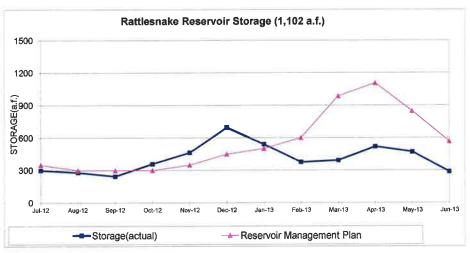

RESERVOIR DATA FY 12-13



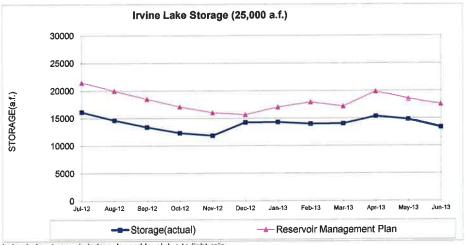
Sand Canyon Reservoir storage is below normal due to light rain.



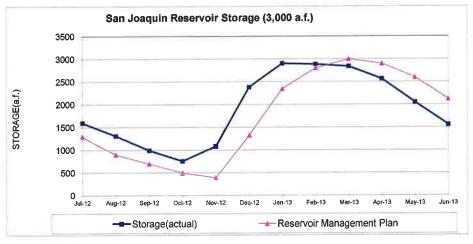
Rattlesnake Reservoir storage is below normal due to light rain.

URBAN RUNOFF DIVERSION PROJECT EXPENDITURE AUTHORIZATION

SUMMARY:

Staff is managing preliminary design work for the Urban Runoff Diversion Project that will divert dewatering project flows that are high in concentrations of nitrate and selenium to Orange County Sanitation District. Staff recommends the Board approve an Expenditure Authorization in the amount of \$47,000 for staff time and legal assistance for the Urban Runoff Diversion Project 11631 (3633) which is included in the Fiscal Year (FY) 2013-14 Capital Budget.

BACKGROUND:

The Orange County Flood Control District, City of Irvine, Orange County Public Works, City of Tustin and Caltrans are cooperating in the development of a cost-effective solution for the diversion of dewatering project flows tributary to Peters Canyon Wash that contain high concentrations of nitrate and selenium. Previously, staff managed a concept study that was performed by RBF Consultants that evaluated the feasibility of constructing a collection pipeline along Peters Canyon Wash and San Diego Creek that would discharge to the Orange County Sanitation District's sewer collection system at Main Street.

The project is now moving into the preliminary design phase. IRWD is managing the project for the group but is not contributing funds for the design of the project. The participating agencies will reimburse IRWD for all design and environmental compliance work. An increase in Expenditure Authorization in the amount of \$40,000 is needed for staff time to manage design tasks and \$5,000 for legal assistance.

Staff will return to the Board for the award of professional services agreements for design and environmental compliance tasks with a corresponding request for additional Expenditure Authorization.

FISCAL IMPACTS:

The Urban Runoff Diversion Project is included in the approved FY 2013-14 Capital Budget. The Expenditure Authorization is attached as Exhibit "A" and summarized in the table below.

PLANNING AREA 51 HERITAGE FIELDS REACH B SEWER AND RECYCLED WATER CAPITAL IMPROVEMENTS

SUMMARY:

Heritage Fields El Toro, LLC (Heritage Fields) is currently developing Planning Area (PA) 51 (Great Park) which includes the construction of streets, storm drains, domestic water, sewer, and recycled water improvements. As part of the development, Heritage Fields will construct Reach B IRWD capital facilities under a Supplemental Reimbursement Agreement to the Master Reimbursement Agreement dated August 13, 2012. Staff recommends that the Board:

- Approve Expenditure Authorizations for Projects 21139 and 30393 in the amounts of \$2,588,300 and \$887,700, respectively; and
- Authorize the General Manager to execute a Supplemental Reimbursement Agreement with Heritage Fields for PA 51 Reach B Sewer and Recycled Water capital facilities.

BACKGROUND:

Heritage Fields is moving forward with the construction of Reach B Sewer and Recycled Water improvements from the OCTA Metrolink Right-of-Way to "LV" Street. The project location map is shown as Exhibit "A". The required IRWD domestic water, sewer, and recycled water capital facilities are documented in the PA 31 and 51 Sub-Area Master Plan, as prepared in September 2011.

The Reach B Sewer and Recycled Water capital facilities consist of approximately 5,500 lineal feet of 6-inch to 24-inch diameter sewer and 5,100 lineal feet 12-inch diameter recycled water pipeline. The design and construction of the IRWD facilities will be performed under the terms of an existing Master Reimbursement Agreement between Heritage Fields and IRWD dated August 13, 2012, and as further defined in a Supplemental Reimbursement Agreement. The Supplemental Reimbursement Agreement, attached as Exhibit "B", has been reviewed by IRWD legal counsel.

Heritage Fields retained RBF Consulting to prepare the Reach B Sewer and Recycled Water improvement plans and they received bids from three contractors in April 2013. Heritage Fields recommends awarding the construction contract to the lowest bidder, FYDAQ, for a bid amount of \$2,013,661 as shown in Exhibit "C". In addition, Heritage Fields has received consultant proposals for geotechnical observation and testing, surveying, engineering services, field archeological/paleontological monitoring, and environmental compliance and auditing. Staff has reviewed the consultant proposals and the construction bids and found the amounts to be acceptable. A summary of the Reach B Sewer and Recycled Water Capital Improvement costs is shown below.

SUPPLEMENTAL REIMBURSEMENT AGREEMENT BY AND BETWEEN IRVINE RANCH WATER DISTRICT AND

HERITAGE FIELDS EL TORO, LLC

This SUPPLEMENTAL REIMBURSEMENT AGREEMENT ("Agreement") is entered into as of this day of, 20, by and between Irvine Ranch Water District, a California water district formed and existing pursuant to the California Water District Law of the State of California ("IRWD"), and Heritage Fields El Toro, LLC, a Delaware limited liability company ("COMPANY"). All capitalized terms used herein and not otherwise defined shall have the meanings given such terms in the Reimbursement Agreement.
WHEREAS, IRWD and COMPANY have previously entered into that certain Reimbursement Agreement dated("Reimbursement Agreement") respecting construction of Capital Facilities; and
WHEREAS, said Reimbursement Agreement made reference to the fact that certain supplemental agreements would be entered into by the parties regarding construction of Capital Facilities and reimbursement therefor consistent with the provisions of said Reimbursement Agreement; and
WHEREAS, the parties now wish to enter this Agreement regarding the construction of Capital Facilities described below, subject to all of the terms of the Reimbursement Agreement, except as provided herein.
NOW, THEREFORE, the parties agree, in consideration of the mutual promises and covenants hereinafter set forth, do agree as follows:
1. Except as provided herein, the parties hereby incorporate by reference all of the terms and conditions of the Reimbursement Agreement into this Agreement.
2. The name of the Project to which this Agreement pertains is: Reach B Sewer and Zone C Recycled Water Pipeline between the Orange County Transportation Authority Railway Right-of-Way and "LV" Street.

The Project is depicted on Exhibit 1 attached to this Agreement.

3. The Capital Facilities to be constructed pursuant to this Agreement are as follows: Approximately 5,500 lineal feet of 6-inch to 24-inch sewer and 5,100 lineal feet of 12-inch recycled water pipelines as shown in Exhibit 1.

- 4. The total costs for the Capital Facilities shall include, but not limited to, the actual costs for construction, surveying, compaction testing, permits, construction bonds, legal fees and an administration fee equal to one percent (1%) of the actual cost of construction (all such actual costs are collectively referred to as the "Costs"). The estimated amount of the Costs is \$2,800,000.
- 5. The following special terms apply to the construction of the Capital Facilities under this Agreement and supersede the provisions of the original Reimbursement Agreement referenced above: None.
- 6. In accordance with Section 10 of the Reimbursement Agreement, COMPANY is executing concurrently herewith an Assignment Agreement in the form of Exhibit 2, to be effective upon the Effective Date specified in the Assignment Agreement.

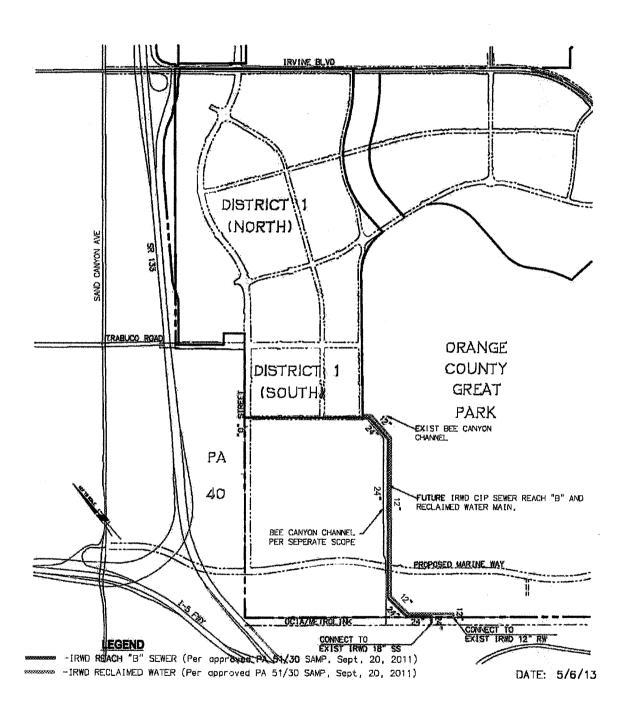

PLANNING AREA 9B (STONEGATE) JEFFREY ROAD PIPELINES <u>CONTRACT CHANGE ORDER</u>

SUMMARY:

Irvine Community Development Company (ICDC) is proceeding with Planning Area (PA) 9B (Stonegate) development including Jeffrey Road improvements and backbone street improvements. As part of the development projects, ICDC will design and construct IRWD's domestic water, sewer, and recycled water capital facilities under a Supplemental Reimbursement Agreement. Staff has identified a future IRWD pump station to be constructed, and laterals to the future pump station site can be installed concurrently with the Jeffrey Road Pipelines project. Staff recommends that the Board approve a contract change order in the amount of \$180,205 to the Reimbursement Agreement with the Irvine Community Development Company for PA 9B Jeffrey Road Pipelines, Projects 10423, 30422, and 30389 to perform this additional lateral work.

BACKGROUND:

The Jeffrey Road Pipelines are currently being constructed between Irvine Boulevard and Portola Parkway in PA 9B. The project includes construction of approximately 5,000 lineal feet of 12-inch Zone 3 domestic water pipeline, 2,700 lineal feet of 36-inch Zone A recycled water pipeline, 2,700 lineal feet of 36-inch syphon pipeline, 4,800 lineal feet of 16-inch Zone B recycled water pipeline, and 1,400 lineal feet of 6-inch, 12-inch, and 20-inch Zone C recycled water pipelines.

A future IRWD pump station site has recently being identified on the northwest corner of Jeffrey Road and Irvine Boulevard (as provided in Exhibit "A"). This pump station is planned to be a multi-zone station including Zone A to Syphon, Syphon to Zone B, and Syphon to Zone C. Staff recommends that the laterals to the future pump station site be installed with the current Jeffrey Road Pipelines project to minimize construction cost, traffic impacts, and future disruption to residents. The laterals include a 16-inch Zone B lateral, 20-inch Zone C lateral, 36-inch Zone A lateral and 36-inch Syphon lateral into the new pump station site. ICDC's contractor, Leatherwood Construction, submitted a construction change order to perform the work in the amount of \$180,205 (as provided in Exhibit "B"). Staff has negotiated the construction change order with Leatherwood Construction and believes that the costs are reasonable and recommends approval.

FISCAL IMPACTS:

Projects 10423 (1519), 30422 (1024), and 30389 (4176) are included in the FY 2013-14 Capital Budget. The existing Expenditure Authorizations are sufficient to fund the construction change order.

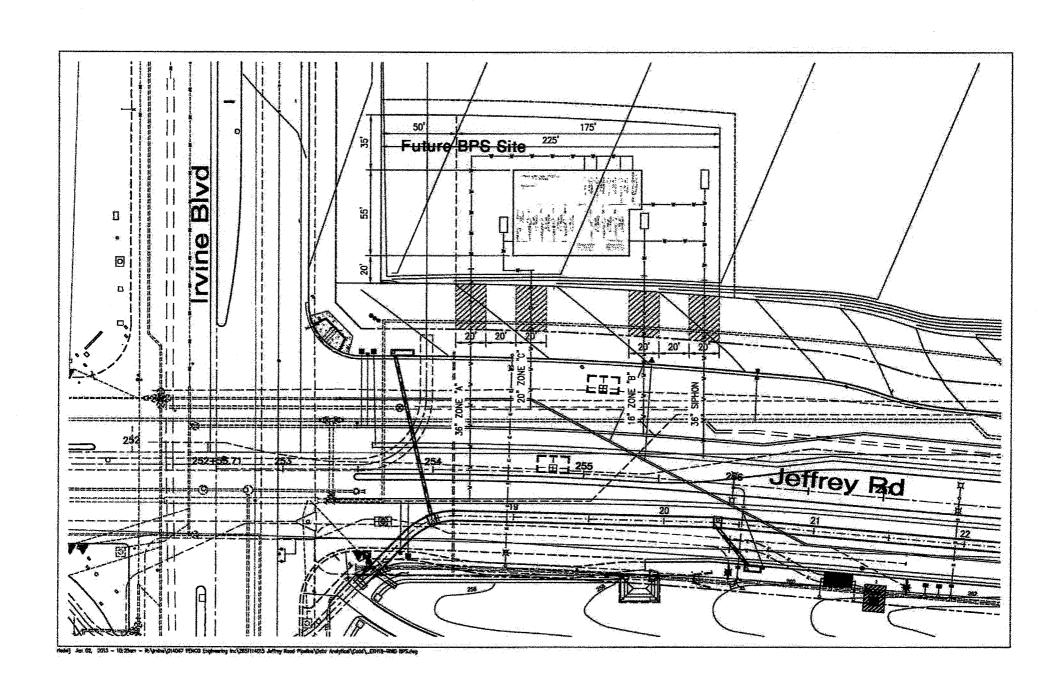

THREE-YEAR CATHODIC PROTECTION MONITORING PROGRAM CONSULTANT SELECTION FOR FISCAL YEARS 2013-14 THROUGH 2015-16

SUMMARY:

The District uses cathodic protection systems to protect essential metallic pipelines and steel tank reservoirs identified as having a high rate of corrosion potential. These cathodic protection systems require periodic monitoring, evaluation and adjustment to ensure optimal protection of the pipelines and structures. The District routinely utilizes consultant services to perform these functions. Staff recommends that the Board authorize the General Manager to execute a Professional Services Agreement with RBF Consulting (RBF) in the amount of \$236,505 for the Cathodic Protection Monitoring Program for FY 2013-14 through FY 2015-16.

BACKGROUND:

The District uses impressed current and galvanic cathodic protection systems (CP Systems) to protect metallic pipelines and reservoirs from corrosion. CP Systems utilize anode beds and electric current requiring periodic monitoring, evaluation and adjustment to ensure optimal protection of the facilities. The District has routinely utilized consultant services to monitor, evaluate and adjust the 19 metallic pipeline and 13 steel tank reservoir CP Systems for a two-year period. This monitoring contract will be for a three-year period and includes the addition of three pipelines and five steel reservoirs due to the recent CP System installation on the University Drive and Kelvin Avenue pipelines and on the Santiago Canyon reservoirs.

Consultant Selection:

A Request for Proposal was issued on May 13, 2013 to five corrosion consultants: Corrpro Companies, Farwest Corrosion, HDR/Schiff, RBF and R.F. Yeager Engineering. Of the five consultants, Farwest declined to attend the pre-proposal meeting and did not submit a proposal. Staff evaluated the proposals using the consultants' team, project approach, and relevant experience as criteria. The Selection Matrix is attached as Exhibit "A". RBF based its proposed labor hours on their current experience performing as the incumbent cathodic protection monitoring consultant. Their amount is consistent with the hours used in the previous eight years of the program. R.F. Yeager Engineering's and HDR/Schiff's proposed labor hours for data collection are lower than what is expected to monitor the 18 reservoirs and approximately 67 miles of pipelines with approximately 500 test stations. Although RBF's fee is slightly higher than the others, RBF has provided excellent service for the past two years, has maintained their schedule, and kept costs within budget. RBF has also provided value-added services, e.g. GPS location aerial exhibits of the test stations. Staff ranked RBF as the best consultant and recommends awarding a three-year Professional Service Agreement for cathodic protection monitoring to RBF in the amount of \$236,505. RBF's proposal is attached as Exhibit "B".

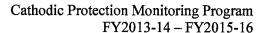

SECTION I:PROJECT UNDERSTANDING/APPROACH/SCOPE OF WORK

General

RBF Consulting's project understanding and approach for monitoring the impressed current and galvanic cathodic protection systems is based on our discussion with IRWD Staff, site visits, and successful experience on the previous monitoring and survey projects performed for Irvine Ranch Water District (Santiago Aqueduct Commission) and other Districts.

PROJECT UNDERSTANDING AND APPROACH

It is our understanding that this project is part of IRWD's on-going operation of maintaining their water facilities. The monitoring of the 17 impressed current cathodic protection (ICCP) systems and 2 galvanic systems for various pipelines, totaling approximately 67 miles with 20 reservoirs (6 rectifiers, 13 galvanic) is part of the District's annual maintenance program. The program ensures safe operation of the cathodic protection systems and integrity of existing structures.

A thorough survey and rectifier adjustment is crucial in maintaining the longevity of equipment and facilities. Our approach assumes that all rectifiers are operational and in proper working order.

PROJECT SCOPE

The proposed scope of work includes the following Tasks:

The RBF team will utilize the same techniques which have proven to be successful from the previous monitoring program (FY 2011/2012 and 2012/2013).

Kickoff Meeting

A kickoff for the next fiscal year program will be initiated during the Final Review Meeting between RBF and IRWD.

Task 1 - Initial Background Material Review

Due to RBF's on-going contracts with IRWD, most of the background material for the majority of pipelines has already been collected. RBF's involvement with the previous monitoring project and construction phase assistance for the newly constructed CP systems will allow us to "hit the ground running" with minimal additional background material. As in the past projects, additional background material for the added pipelines/reservoirs includes but not limited to the following:



- Atlas maps
- As-Built drawings
- Potential readings: All previous potential readings will be provided to the consultant by IRWD in tabular form where available. GPS data, northing/easting, and/or latitude/longitude data of test station locations will be supplied.
- Rectifier Readings: All previous rectifier readings will be provided to the consultant by IRWD in tabular form where available.
- Reservoir internal inspection reports (as needed).
- Historical cathodic protection reports and recommendations (as needed).

Task 2 — Initial Data Collection

RBF will collect the following data to ensure CP systems are operating in accordance with NACE standards:

- For pipelines:
 - o Collect CPTS pipe-to-soil potentials with rectifier on and instant off. It is understood that approximately 50 CTS's are missing or paved over. Obtaining data for these CTS's are not included within the scope.
- For reservoirs:
 - o Tank-to-water potentials at the bottom and every 1' of elevation
 - Tank bottom-to-soil potentials at four compass points
- Collect rectifier output and anode readings for pipelines and reservoirs
- Recommend repair and maintenance items discovered during data collection to be corrected by IRWD.
- IRWD will assist with traffic control in obtaining data for 6 particular areas of pipelines 7 (University), 42 (Dyer Road), and 79 (Green Acres Pipeline).

Task 3 — Impressed Current Cathodic Protection System Adjustments

Adjustments will be made to the ICCP systems in order to provide the optimum level of protection for the pipelines and reservoirs in accordance with NACE International standards including RP-0169-02 Control of External Corrosion on Underground or Submerged Piping Systems, RP-0196 Internal Galvanic CP for Water Tanks, RP-0193 External On-Grade Tank Bottoms, RP-0388 Internal ICCP for Water Tanks. This effort has been combined with Task 2 on the fee schedule.

Task 4 - Initial Report

The draft Initial Report of the baseline data will be submitted to IRWD within eight (8) weeks after the Notice to Proceed. Four (4) copies and one electronic copy in PDF format will be submitted to IRWD for review. A comments meeting will follow IRWD's review of the draft Initial Report. Four (4) weeks following the comments meeting, four (4) hardcopies and an electronic file for the Initial Report, including incorporated comments, will be submitted. Please refer to the schedule found in Section III.



Task 5 – Quarterly Data and Updates

Monitor rectifier output/anode readings and adjust the ICCP systems as needed for the three quarters following Tasks 1 thru 3. The budget reflects quarterly readings of rectifier anodes, anodes midway between rectifiers and at end locations of pipelines. RBF will provide updates to IRWD in a technical memorandum format for each quarterly reading.

Reservoirs with galvanic cathodic protection systems will not be included in the quarterly data collection. These systems are only tested once per year.

Task 6 - Final Report

The draft Final Report is to be submitted to IRWD following the 3rd quarter data collection. Four (4) hardcopies and one electronic copy in PDF format will be submitted to IRWD for review. A comment meeting will follow IRWD's review of the draft Final Report. Within four (4) weeks following the comments meeting, four (4) hardcopies and an electronic file for the Final Report, including incorporated comments, will be submitted.

The final report shall be prepared, including the following:

- a. Presentation of the initial, quarterly and final data in tabular and graphical form which shall include the data observations and results of the field surveys, calculations, estimates, analyses, and the engineer's recommendations.
- b. Determination of interference on project pipelines from other cathodic protection systems and/or stray currents.

RBF will be watchful for various facilities in the areas of the pipelines:

- Overhead and buried power lines
- Any pumping facilities with variable speed drives (sewer plants, lift stations, irrigation pumps, etc.)
- Other purveyors' rectifiers in close proximity to the water systems namely petroleum gas lines.

All of which are potential sources of stray current that could affect the District's CP systems. Stray currents will more than likely be noticed during rectifier adjustments when a scope is used for the adjustment process. RBF will update the District on any findings of stray current and measures to be taken to protect the District's facilities.

- c. Negative impacts on adjacent pipelines and recommendations for corrective measures.
- d. Summary of cathodic protection system adjustments.



- e. Recommendations for repair and maintenance items discovered during data collection to be corrected by IRWD.
- f. Recommendations for the type and extent of additional cathodic protection facilities including test stations, bonds or insulators that might be needed.
- g. Recommendations for the repair or replacement of cathodic protection facilities including anodes, rectifiers, permanent reference cell electrodes, and additional test stations.
- h. An engineer's estimate of the design and construction costs of recommended facilities.

Task 7 - Troubleshooting

As requested in the RFP, thirty (30) hours of troubleshooting has been included within each fiscal year fee schedule. The hours are broken out to include field and office time. This task will be considered a time and materials effort and will only be used if needed.

Value-Added Measures

There are various measures that RBF will provide as a value added scope for IRWD.

Creation of Exhibits Using IRWD's GIS Database

RBF can incorporate information found in the field using GPS coordinates and combine this with GIS data provided from IRWD in order to create exhibits for the report and comment meeting. RBF has found that these exhibits aid in the review meeting discussion so that all staff are aware of the specific location(s) under review. Updates to past exhibits can be prepared and included within the report.

Revision Changes to As-Built Drawings

During the data collection process, should test stations be located in areas that are not consistent with as-built drawings, RBF will assist the District in red lining plans to correct the plan document.

General Rectifier Condition Assessment

During the readings and adjustment of rectifiers, RBF will measure the output ohm resistance on the deep anode wells. This can provide an estimated life expectancy of the anode well. The life span of this costly item will be an important factor for budgeting purposes.

Another factor that affects the rectifier life expectancy is the condition of vent lines from the anode. This vent must be open to allow either chlorine or oxygen gas to dissipate. In many situations, RBF has found this vent line capped, damaged, or improperly constructed resulting in the termination of the anode well. More often, a new anode well must be constructed.



The general interior and exterior of rectifiers must also be checked for general potential safety problems. Typically, safety concerns are related to older rectifier units. As an example, rectifiers must have a current disconnect on the outside of the cabinet. And, in general, rodents frequently nest in rectifier cabinet boxes, causing rectifiers to short out causing costly repairs. RBF will assess these items and provide updates and recommendations for the District.

Traffic Control Plans

RBF is capable of creating traffic control plans should they be required as part of an encroachment permit requirement. RBF has previous background history in providing traffic control measures for the City of Irvine. Traffic control plans can be created in-house to ensure a timely and quality product.

Assumptions:

The proposed scope of work does not include Corrosion Services for the following:

- Design, construction or inspection of new facilities.
- Failure analysis.
- Repair and/or replacement of cathodic protection stations or damaged or missing cathodic test stations other than those listed above.

It is anticipated that these services would be provided for under a separate agreement, if required.
