## WATER RESOURCES POLICY AND COMMUNICATIONS COMMITTEE

### 2024 LEGISLATIVE AND REGULATORY UPDATE

#### SUMMARY:

This report provides an update on the 2023-2024 legislative session, regulatory issues, and IRWD priorities. As legislation and regulations develop, staff will provide updates and recommendations to the Water Resources Policy and Communications Committee and the Board, as appropriate. This month, staff recommends the Board consider the following actions/positions:

- *AB 2579 (Quirk-Silva) — County of Orange Property Tax Revenue Allocation: “WATCH;”*
- *AB 2729 (Patterson) — Residential fees and charges: “SEEK AMENDMENTS;”*
- *SB 1210 (Skinner) — Electrical, Gas, Sewer and Water Service Connect Charges; “SEEK AMENDMENTS;” and*
- *SB 1218 (Newman) — Emergency Water Supplies: “SPONSOR/ SUPPORT;”*

#### BACKGROUND:

Approximately 4,816 bills and constitutional amendments have been introduced during the 2023-2024 state legislative session, which is 356 more than this time in the 2021-2022 legislative session. On the Assembly side, 3,295 bills and constitutional amendments were introduced while the Senate introduced 1,512 bills and constitutional amendments. In 2024 alone, there were approximately 2,124 bills introduced. The 2024 introductions were split between 1,505 Assembly Bills and 619 Senate Bills.

The 2024 bill introduction deadline was February 16, 2024. While many of the bills introduced this year contain spot or intent language, many include substantive proposals. With the introduction deadline having passed, the 2024 legislative year will come into full swing with policy committees ramping up and legislators working to amend their legislation so that it will be heard by the April 26 and May 3 policy committee deadlines.

The bills introduced cover a variety of issues of interest to IRWD, including bills related to water conservation, water quality, and connections fees. There are also a number of bills related to climate change, public works, and public contracting. Many of these bills are expected to have significant amendments prior to their first policy committee hearings. As such, staff will monitor proposals and bring updates and recommendations to the Water Resources Policy and Communications Committee and the Board, as appropriate.

A copy of the 2024 Legislative Matrix is attached as Exhibit “A”. Links to the bills discussed below are included within each discussion unless a separate exhibit is noted.

### 2024 State Budget:

On February 20, 2024, the Legislative Analyst's Office (LAO) released its "[The 2024-25 Budget: Deficit Update](#)." The update examined the budget deficit the State can anticipate for the Fiscal Year 2024-2025 budget year. When the LAO had looked at the projected budget deficit in early January, it estimated the deficit to be \$58 billion. With the most recent update, the LOA has increased its estimated by \$15 billion to a projected budget deficit of \$73 billion. With the updated projection the LOA cautioned that the deficit could grow by the time the Governor releases his May Revise. Specifically, noting that:

"The actual increase in the state's budget problem will depend on a number of factors, including formula-driven spending changes, most notably Proposition 98 spending requirements for schools and community colleges. (Due to specific circumstances this year, changes in revenues are unlikely to have a significant effect on the state's other major formula-driven spending requirements, specifically related to Proposition 2.)"

The update also noted one of the options for addressing the additional budget shortfall was reducing one-time and temporary spending. Staff will update the Committee on the discussion taking place around the budget and infrastructure funding reductions.

### 2024 State Legislative Update:

#### *"Making Conservation a California Way of Life" and Water Efficiency Related Legislation:*

In response to the LAO's report entitled "[Assessing Early Implementation of Urban Water Use Efficiency Requirements](#)" and concerns raised by urban water suppliers, members of the Legislature have introduced five bills related to the "Making Conservation a California Way of Life" laws. Two the bills, [AB 2894 \(Gallagher, R-Chico\)](#) and [SB 1185 \(Niello, R-Roseville\)](#), are spot bills without any substantive provisions. The other three bills are:

- [AB 3121 \(Hart, D-Santa Barbara\) – Conservation Orders](#): AB 3121, authored by Assemblymember Gregg Hart (D, Santa Barbara), would modify the enforcement provisions of the "Making Conservation a California Way of Law." Currently the State Water Resources Control Board (State Board) may issue informational orders to an urban retail water supplier that fails to meet its urban water use object by January 1, 2024. The State Board's enforcement authority increases in 2025, at which point it may issue a written notice to an urban retail water supplier that does not meet its urban water use objection beginning January 1, 2025. Beginning in 2026, the State Board may issue a conservation order to an urban retail water supplier that fails to meet its urban water use object. AB 3121 proposes to move the dates at which the State Board may issue a written notice and a conservation order back one year;
- [SB 1110 \(Ashby, D-Sacramento\) – Conservation Orders](#): Like AB 3121, SB 1110 by Senator Angelique Ashby (D, Sacramento) seeks to change the enforcement authority granted to the State Board for an urban retail water supplier's failure to meet the urban water use object. Instead of proposes date changes, SB 1110 seeks to add criteria the State Board needs to consider before invoking enforcement against a supplier; and

- [SB 1330 \(Archuleta, D-Norwalk\) – Urban Retail Water Supplier Water Use](#): SB 1330 proposes the most substantial changes to the “Making Conservation a California Way of Life” laws out of the five bills on the subject. Specifically, SB 1330 would require the State Board to adopt the variances as they were proposed to the Department of Water Resources (DWR) without a level of significance and data reporting currently proposed by the State Board. The bill would also eliminate the need for the State Board to approve the use of a variance; allow urban retail water supplies to include a 20 percent irrigable-not-irrigate allowance within its urban water use objective; would extend the start dates for the State Board’s enforcement authorities; and require DWR to collect and update residential and commercial, industrial and institution landscape data for each supplier every 10 years.

There is also an additional bill related that are tangentially related to the “Making Conservation a California Way of Life” laws. That bill is [AB 2947](#), authored by Assemblymember Lackey (R-Palmdale), the relates to DWR’s turf replacement funding program.

Staff will update the Committee on the discussions taking place in Sacramento on the “Making Conservation a California Way of Life” laws. Given the wide variety of discussions taking place, staff recommends the Board wait to adopt a position on each of these bills until there is a better understanding of what changes the State Board is proposing to its draft regulation to implement of these laws. Staff expect to have a better understanding of those changes within the next month.

#### *Connection Fees and Development Impact Fees:*

As noted in the February 2024 Legislative and Regulatory Update, again, this legislative year, Assemblymember Grayson joined by others has introduced legislation related to the fees charged on new housing development. For example, Assemblymember Pilar Schiavo (D, Santa Clarita) joined by Assemblymember Tim Grayson (D, Concord) introduced [AB 1820](#). As currently drafted, AB 1820 would permit a development proponent to request a preliminary fee and exaction estimate when it submits an application to a local government.

Senate Scott Wiener (D-San Francisco) also joined by Assemblymember Grayson introduced [SB 937](#). SB 937 seeks to change when fees related to a development are due to a local agency, and specifically makes water and sewer connection fees subject to portions of the Mitigation Fee Act. These two changes would likely impact IRWD’s current connection fee process.

In addition to AB 1820 and SB 937, on February 15, Senator Nancy Skinner (D, Oakland) introduced [SB 1210](#) and Assemblymember Joe Patterson (R, Rocklin) introduced [AB 2729](#). SB 1210 would prohibit an electric, gas, sewer or water service connection fee for new housing construction from exceeding one percent of the reported building permit value of that housing unit. The bill would also require that the connection fee be spread over a period of at least 10 years. AB 2729 would change the point at which a local agency would levy a fee or charge for public improvements on a new residential development.

Staff have been and will continue to monitor these bills and work to mitigate any impact they may have on IRWD. To position the District to best mitigate any impacts of these bills, the Board previously adopted a “watch” position on AB 1820 and a “seek amendments” position on SB 937. Staff recommends that the Board adopt a “seek amendments” position on SB 1210 and AB 2729 with the proposed amendments being the removal of special districts from the bill.

*AB 2579 (Quirk-Silva, D-Fullerton) – County of Orange Property Tax Revenue Allocation:*

AB 2579, authored by Assemblymember Sharron Quirk-Silva (D, Fullerton), seeks to address the lower share of property tax revenue the County of Orange receives as compared to other counties. Specifically, the bill would require the auditor of the County of Orange to increase the total amount of ad valorem property tax revenue that is otherwise required to be allocated to the County and to commensurately decrease the amount of ad valorem property tax revenue that is otherwise required to be allocated to the County Educational Revenue Augmentation Fund, which is generally allocated to school districts.

AB 2579 is similar to other bills the Assemblymember has authored in the past seeking to increase the amount of property tax received by the County of Orange. In the past, the Board has adopted a “watch” position on those bills and authorized staff to move to an “oppose” position should the bill negatively impact the District’s property tax revenues. Staff recommends that the District take that same approach to AB 2579 this week, and that the Board adopt a “watch” position on AB 2579.

*SB 1218 (Newman, D-Fullerton) - Emergency Water Supplies:*

SB 1218, authored by Senator Josh Newman (D, Fullerton), is IRWD second sponsored legislative proposal this year. The bill would declare it is the established policy of the state to encourage and incentivize, but not mandate, the development of emergency water supplies, and to support their use during times of water shortage. Staff recommends that the Board adopt a “sponsor/support” position on the bill.
