

WELCOME TO SAN JOAQUIN WILDLIFE SANCTUARY (SJWS)

Owned and operated by the Irvine Ranch Water District, this 300-acre freshwater marsh is a quiet sanctuary for wildlife and people. Over 282 bird species, including 170 regularly-occurring species and another 112 less frequently observed species, have been documented through visitor and staff observations. With year-round resident birds, wintering species, summering species and fall/spring migrants, you are guaranteed good birding no matter when you visit!

Use the abundance graphs to discover which species are likely present and during what time of year. Visitors are encouraged to report their sightings on the Audubon House front porch and to document unusual species or times (with photos, sketches and/or written description) to the Audubon House volunteer on duty. Your input will help expand our knowledge of bird status and distribution at SJWS.

KEY TO ABUNDANCE CODES

The abundance codes in the graphs are defined as follows:

- Abundant > 50 individuals, seen on nearly all visits
- Common > 25 individuals, seen on most visits at the right time of year
- Uncommon < 20 individuals, not always seen on every visit
- •••• Rare < 5 individuals, not always present, even at the right time of year Absent, not expected at that time of year

Less Frequently Observed < 10 accepted records at SJWS

REPORTING AND DOCUMENTATION

This checklist updates the 1999 checklist compiled by Charles Austin. It is based upon daily and monthly sightings and census data from 1999 to 2010 and includes observations from SJWS and adjacent San Diego Creek. Abundance graphs for regularly-occurring species are based upon observer data at SJWS and county-wide patterns as reported in *The Birds of Orange County California: Status and Distribution* (1996) by Robert Hamilton and Douglas Willick.
