Dial it down: Give your plants a break

Our plants are entering a period of dormancy. As the days get shorter, their metabolism slows down so they need less water.

This is the time of year when plants build their root systems in preparation for the year ahead.

In October, set your timer to 50%, or to:

- Two 3-minute cycles three days a week for grass
- Two 3-minute cycles two days a week for climateappropriate plants

California native corner Juan's October plant: Pajaro manzanita

Pajaro manzanita (*Arctostaphylos* pajaroensis) is a beautiful evergreen shrub, stunning for its bright red, almost flame-like new growth of foliage that fades to a gray-green rimmed with reddish margins that make a great contrast against the plant's magenta shredding bark.

Light pink flower clusters bloom winter through spring, giving way to red berries that attract birds — hence the name *pajaro*, meaning *bird*.

It's a perfect native shrub for any landscape.





Q: I'm moving. How can I transfer service to my new address?

A: New and existing residential customers can start or stop service online. To submit a request, just go to IRWD.com/startstop.

If your current and future addresses are both within our service area, you'll need to fill out two requests: one to stop service at your current address for a particular date, and another to start service at your future address.

To start service, you will need to provide a service address, mailing address and phone number. A nonrefundable, one-time service fee of \$25 will be applied to your first bill, along with a \$50 deposit.
