Got a pool? Time for a leak check

With summer nearly over, your pool may be all but forgotten. That makes this the ideal time to see if it's losing water. The bucket test makes it easy.

First, shut off the autofill valve. Then place a bucket in your pool, such as on the first step, and fill it to the pool's water level. Mark the water level on the bucket. If after a day or two the pool level drops below that mark, you probably have a leak.



Your autofill valve may also be wasting water. Turn it back on after the test. If you hear a hissing sound even though the pool is filled, it may need adjusting or repairs.

Q: Juan, what's the best way to water in this heat?

A: Hand-watering is one of the most efficient ways to get water directly to your plants where it's needed, so nothing goes to waste. Use a hose nozzle to apply just the right amount of water and avoid spraying where

water's not needed. Go from one plant to another and circle back two or three times to allow the water you've applied to soak deep into the roots.

California native corner

Juan's September plant: Elizabeth bush anemone

Elizabeth bush anemone (Carpenteria californica 'Elizabeth') is a beautiful, long-lived evergreen shrub with sweetly scented camellia-like flowers. It grows into an upright, compact form up to 6 feet tall, and can be trimmed as a hedge. It prefers fast-draining soils and thrives in both full sun and partial shade.





Q: My toilet keeps me up at night. How can I persuade my partner to get it fixed?

A: A running toilet is a sure sign of a leak, which can waste 200 gallons of water or more each day — more than 6,000 gallons a month!
