

IRWD supports fire resilience and protection

Irvine Ranch Water District works closely with Orange County Fire Authority and other firefighting agencies to prepare for and respond to hazardous conditions before an emergency strikes.

Water supply: We continuously test and maintain our fire hydrants to keep them in good working order, and our open reservoirs are available as water sources for agencies fighting wildfires from airplanes and helicopters.

Monitoring: We track the weather forecast every day for heightened fire risks such as low relative humidity, strong winds, dry brush and more. When these conditions are projected, we top off water storage tanks, which use gravity to distribute water to nearby neighborhoods.

Backup power: Permanent generators at key facilities keep water pumping during power outages, and portable units can be moved to respond to situational needs.

Communication: IRWD is part of a regional emergency response team that meets and communicates regularly to ensure prompt and coordinated action before, during and after emergencies.

Q: Juan. I've heard that drip irrigation uses more water. Is that true?

A: Glad you asked. No. Drip systems use significantly less water because they apply water directly to the root zone so no water is wasted. Be sure, though, to follow the right irrigation schedule for your system. Overhead sprinklers apply water in gallons per minute; drip systems in gallons per hour. Do you have point source drip

emitters or inline tubing? Find out the recommended schedule for each system at IRWD.com/wateringguide or create your own customized schedule at IRWD.com/calculator.

California native cornerJuan's March plant: Narrow leaf milkweed

Bring back the monarchs! Narrow leaf milkweed (Asclepias fascicularis) is a native milkweed species essential to the survival of this threatened migratory butterfly. Blooming with clusters of lavender or pinkish-white flowers from summer to fall, it's also a beautiful addition to any pollinator garden. Sow seeds in late fall to prepare them for spring germination, or contact your local nursery to see if they carry native (not tropical) milkweed plants in spring.
